SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO RECOMMEND LAWS AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION DIRECTOR AND OFFICER EDUCATION AND TRAINING.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has the highest number of condominium 1 association board of directors and officers' liability insurance 2 claims in the country and the amount of the claims are larger 3 4 than those on the mainland; and 5 WHEREAS, most, if not all, of the claims made can be 6 attributed to a lack of knowledge or experience of unpaid, 7 8 volunteer directors of condominium associations relating to their respective governing documents, responsibilities as board 9 members, and their liability for their failure to act in 10 accordance with their fiduciary duties; and 11 12 WHEREAS, because insurance carriers in the State that 13 provide directors and officers liability insurance policies for 14 15 condominium associations have diminished to only two or three carriers, the claims have caused all condominium association 16 director and officer insurance coverage premiums across the 17 State to increase, as all condominium associations are in the 18 same risk pool; and 19 20 WHEREAS, many of the claims have led to lawsuits that have 21 resulted in substantial legal defense costs and multi-million 22 dollar judgments against the association and their board 23 members, and in some cases, judgment costs are not covered by 24 insurance, meaning they are passed on to owners; and 25 26 WHEREAS, even if claims do not lead to a lawsuit, disputes 27 require the association to incur legal or consultant expenses to 28 29 resolve a dispute, the costs of which are not typically covered by the association's budget; and 30 31

WHEREAS, mandating education for condominium association
directors and officers concerning ethical and legal standards
pertaining to the condominium association may help to avoid

future claims, which may also help to reduce association fees 1 for Hawaii residents; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the Condominium Education Trust Fund has collected 4 substantial funds over the years from condominium associations 5 throughout the State, and one of the purposes of the fund is to 6 educate condominium owners and association directors; now, 7 8 therefore, 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 10 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the 11 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' Real Estate 12 13 Commission is requested to convene a task force to recommend laws and regulations concerning the mandatory educational, 14 training, and certification requirements of condominium 15 association directors and officers; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 18 19 include the following members: 20 Chairperson of the Real Estate Commission or their 21 (1) designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the task 22 23 force: 24 A representative from the Community Associations 25 (2) Institute; 26 27 A representative from the Hawaii Council of Community (3) 28 Associations: 29 30 A representative from an organization that advocates 31 (4) for owners, to be selected by the chairperson; 32 33 (5) Representatives from three property management 34 companies that operate in more than one county in the 35 State, to be selected by the chairperson; 36 37 (6) A representative from the Hawaii Association of 38 REALTORS; 39 40 41 (7) A representative from the insurance industry licensed to practice in the State who is familiar with 42

directors and officers' liability insurance claims and 1 policies, to be selected by the chairperson; 2 3 A member of the Senate appointed by the President of 4 (8) 5 the Senate; 6 A member of the House of Representatives appointed by 7 (9) the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and 8 9 Any other stakeholders deemed appropriate and 10 (10)necessary by the chairperson; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 13 14 consider the following: 15 The development of a curriculum to be adopted by the (1)16 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and to be 17 completed by each director of a condominium 18 19 association that covers topics including but not limited to the association's governing documents, 20 directors' fiduciary duties and personal liability 21 that may result from any breach of that duty, 22 applicable codes of conduct, conflicts of interest, 23 the business judgment rule, and confidentially; 24 25 Whether associations' legal counsel or stakeholder (2) 26 groups can perform educational seminars to certify 27 directors upon completion of the approved curriculum; 28 29 30 (3) Whether funds can be used from the Condominium Education Trust Fund to procure a vendor to create and 31 administer webinars to educate and certify directors 32 based on the approved curriculum; 33 34 (4) Enforcement remedies for noncompliance; and 35 36 (5) Any other matters deemed appropriate by the 37 chairperson; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 40 submit to the Legislature its findings, recommendations, and any 41

proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the 1 convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the Senate; 5 Speaker of the House of Representatives; Director of Commerce 6 and Consumer Affairs; Chairperson of the Real Estate Commission; 7 Community Associations Institute; Hawaii Council of Community 8 Associations; Hawaii Council of Associations of Apartment 9

10 Owners; and Hawaii Association of REALTORS.

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
