SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO REVIEW THE FUNCTIONS AND OPERATIONS OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT AND IDENTIFY, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING, ANY FUNCTIONS OR OPERATIONS THAT CAN BE MODIFIED IN A COST-EFFECTIVE MANNER TO MEET THE CHANGING NEEDS OF THE PUBLIC.

WHEREAS, the State has a responsibility to provide services 1 2 to the public in the most efficient and effective manner 3 possible; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the rapid global spread of the coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, prompted Governor David Ige to declare a 6 state of emergency and issue several supplemental emergency 7 proclamations that imposed stay-at-home orders, mandatory 8 physical distancing measures, and a mandatory fourteen-day 9 quarantine for incoming visitors and residents, all of which 10 11 have severely impacted the State's economy and especially local businesses, workers, and residents; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic exposed the need for the state government to adjust its operations and shift employees in 15 16 order to provide vital services to the public more responsively 17 and effectively; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has caused, and is continuing to cause, the State to reconsider the ways in which 20 governmental services are provided, including the use of 21 22 technology and the repurposing of offices, to safeguard the safety and health of the public and the State's employees; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, as the State prepares its workforce for the future post-pandemic world, each of the State's departments and 26 27 agencies will need to evaluate its existing systems and make any 28 changes necessary to address deficiencies in that department or 29 agency and improve the overall organization and functions of the state government; and 30

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A representative of the House of Representatives, to 1 (4) 2 be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives; and 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Human Resources 5 Development is requested to invite the following to participate 6 7 on the task force: 8 9 (1)The Executive Director of the Hawaii Government 10 Employees Association or the Executive Director's 11 designee; and 12 The State Director of United Public Workers or the 13 (2)14 State Director's designee; and 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 16 evaluate the state government's current functions and services 17 18 and recommend to each affected department and agency improvements to that department or agency's programs and 19 20 operations that could benefit residents of the State; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the 23 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 24 the Regular Session of 2022; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall cease to 27 exist upon the adjournment sine die of the Regular Session of 28 29 2022; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, President of the 32 Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Attorney 33 General, Director of Human Resources Development, Executive 34 Director of the Hawaii Government Employees Association, and 35 36 State Director of United Public Workers.

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
