SB 2708, SD2 (SSCR3355) Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISES.

AGR, JUD, FIN

Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to plan, design, construct, operate, manage, maintain, repair, demolish, and remove infrastructure on any lands under the jurisdiction of the department, to support and promote agriculture. Establishes the agricultural enterprise program. Establishes the Agricultural Enterprise Special Fund. Requires the Board of Agriculture to annually report an accounting of nonagricultural park lessees to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.

Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 2099, SD2 (SSCR3122)

RELATING TO IRRIGATION.

AGR, LAB, FIN

Status

Transfers to the Department of Agriculture operational authority over portions of the East Kauai Irrigation System operated and maintained by the East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative as of 7/1/2020. Provides a conditional extension to acquire required permits. Establishes staffing positions. Authorizes general obligation bonds for a statewide irrigation system capital improvement project. Appropriates funds.

Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 2723, SD1 (SSCR3052) Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, LHE, FIN

Appropriates funds for the GoFarm Hawaii program. Requires GoFarm Hawaii to provide the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture with an annual report of the program's goals and a semi-annual report outlining program outputs and outcomes. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

SB 2985, SD1 (SSCR3265) Status

RELATING TO VETERINARIANS.

AGR, JUD, FIN

Provides veterinarians who provide emergency care to an animal immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Provides veterinarians who render emergency treatment when there is no veterinarian-client-patient relationship, immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Requires veterinarians to report to law enforcement events of animal injury, death, or abuse where there is reasonable cause to believe that it relates to dog fighting or animal abuse and gives veterinarians immunity from civil liability for making the reports. (SD1)

SB 2955 (SSCR2967) Status

RELATING TO COFFEE LABELING.

AGR, CPC, FIN

Expands the coffee labeling and advertising requirements to include ready-to-drink coffee beverages and inner wrapping or packaging

labels. Effective 7/1/2021.

SB 2050, SD2 (SSCR3237) Status RELATING TO INDUSTRIAL HEMP DERIVED PRODUCTS.

AGR, JUD, FIN

Establishes a regulatory framework for products containing cannabidiol that were manufactured legally through approved

government programs. Clarifies that these products are not considered

adulterated food, beverage, or cosmetic products. Prohibits manufacturers from making health-related claims. Requires product labeling for the products to be legally allowed in the State. Takes

effect 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 3040, SD1 (SSCR3229) Status RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

AGR, JUD, FIN

Requires the Department of Agriculture to provide annual reporting on pesticide inspection and compliance investigations. Increases monetary fines for pesticide violations. Takes effect on 6/18/2050.
