HB 1796, HD1 (HSCR56-20) Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Established the insulin drug task force within the DCCA to study whether cost-sharing limits should be placed on prescription insulin drugs. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	HLT, CPC, FIN
HB 35, HD1 (HSCR53-20) Status	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. Authorizes expenditures from the mental health and substance abuse special fund to be used for capital improvement projects. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	HLT, CPC, FIN
HB 2186, HD1 (HSCR45-20) Status	RELATING TO THE UNDERGROUND CONSTRUCTION OF HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION LINES. Eliminates the requirement for a public utility to seek PUC approval for the underground construction of high-voltage electric transmission	EEP, CPC, FIN

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

Authorizes the Chief Energy Officer of the Hawaii State Energy Office

to adopt rules to enforce minimum efficiency standards for certain products and establish or amend appliance efficiency standards in certain situations. Regulates the appliance efficiency standards for air purifiers and portable electric spas. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (HD1)

HB 2318, HD1 (HSCR39-20) Status

RELATING TO HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS.

Establishes the Safe Home Program to provide matching and nonmatching grants for installation of wind resistive devices to singlefamily, owner-occupied, residential property owners. Creates one

temporary position within the Insurance Division of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to implement and administer the Safe Home Program. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2025. (HD1)
