<u>SB 2277</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH CARE. Allows an unlicensed mental health professional, working under the supervision of a licensed mental health professional, to provide mental health treatments or counseling services to minors without parental or legal guardian consent, knowledge, or participation. Requires a mental health professional to assist a minor with completing a non-disclosure notification form to send to covered entities, when appropriate. Requires a covered entity, upon receiving a completed notification form, to maintain confidentiality of minor-initiated mental health treatment or counseling services.	CPH, JDC
<u>SB 2631</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE MENTAL HEALTH OF DEFENDANTS. Permits judicial discretion for suspension of criminal proceedings for assessment and treatment should the defendant have serious and persistent mental health illness.	CPH, JDC
<u>SB 2506</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SPECIAL FUND. Authorizes the mental health and substance abuse special fund to be used for certain capital improvements. Repeals on June 30, 2025.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2597</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE HOSPITAL. Appropriates funds for the renovation and repurposing of the Guensberg building at the Hawaii state hospital for a secure residential co-occurring treatment program.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2505</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires and appropriates funds for the department of health to establish a continuum of stabilization beds statewide for non- forensic patients with substance abuse or mental health disorders, or both, by repurposing unused state facilities.	CPH, WAM

<u>SB 2982</u> <u>Status &amp;</u> Testimony	RELATING TO THE TRANSITION OF THE OAHU REGIONAL HEALTH CARE SYSTEM FROM THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION INTO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. Sets a date for the transition of the Oahu region's health care facilities from the Hawaii health systems corporation to the department of health. Establishes a working group to develop a comprehensive plan that addresses all necessary components of such transition.	<del>CPH, WAM</del> Measure deleted on 02-03-2020
SB 2504 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE TRANSITION OF THE OAHU REGIONAL HEALTH CARE SYSTEM FROM THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION INTO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. Sets a date for the transition of the Oahu regional health care system from the Hawaii health systems corporation to the department of health. Establishes a working group to develop a comprehensive plan that addresses all necessary components of such transition.	<u>CPH, WAM</u> Measure added on 02-03-2020
SB 2592 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO DRUG TREATMENT. Appropriates funding for the implementation and development of the Hawaii coordinated access recovery entry system to increase access to treatment for all individuals who suffer any form of substance abuse and mental illness. Requires the DOH to pursue all known funding sources for drug treatment programs prior to expending general revenue funds appropriated. Requires DOH to exhaust all public and private insurance options for reimbursement for individual treatment provided before expending appropriated funds.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2773</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO OPIOIDS. Requires providers authorized to prescribe opioids to discuss with patients certain risks associated with controlled substances that are opioids prior to issuing initial opioid prescriptions for the treatment of acute pain. Requires providers to include a note acknowledging the discussion of the risks associated with opioids in the patient's medical record.	CPH, JDC
<u>SB 3045</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUG RATE SETTING. Establishes a prescription affordability commission within the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to review prescription drug costs and establish levels of reimbursement. Appropriates moneys.	CPH, WAM
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGISTS. Requires the board of psychology to establish a pilot program to grant prescriptive authority to qualified psychologist applicants in counties with a population of less than 100,000 persons. Repeals on 8/31/2025.	<u>CPH, JDC</u> Measure added on 02-03-2020

<u>SB 2408</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE COMPOSITION OF THE STATE COUNCIL ON MENTAL HEALTH. Requires the State Council on Mental Health to include at least 3 members with demonstrated knowledge of or work experience involving Native Hawaiian concepts of well-being, culturally grounded mental health methodologies, or traditional healing or health practices.	<u>CPH, WAM</u> Measure added on 02-03-2020
<u>SB 2588</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO JURORS. Permits psychologists to claim exemption from service as a juror.	<u>CPH, JDC</u> <u>Measure added</u> on 02-03-2020
