HB 1608 Status	RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. Authorizes the Department of Health to implement a program for wholesale drug importation.	HLT, CPC, FIN
HB 583 Proposed HD1 Status	RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS. Proposed HD1: Allows primary caregivers, qualifying out-of-state patients, and caregivers of a qualifying out-of-state patient to access the restricted access area within a medical cannabis retail dispensary. Clarifies violations related to medical cannabis dispensaries.	HLT, JUD/CPC, FIN

HB 1609 Status	RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS. Establishes business practice and transparency reporting requirements for pharmacy benefit managers. Replaces the registration requirement for pharmacy benefit managers with a licensing requirement. Increases penalties for violations of the pharmacy benefit managers law. Effective 1/1/2021.	HLT, CPC/JUD, FIN
HB 1796 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Places a cap on the total amount that an insured is required to pay for a prescription insulin drug at \$100 per thirty-day supply of that drug.	HLT, CPC
HB 1795 Status	RELATING TO PHYSICIANS. Outlines when a physician may hold oneself out as being certified by a specialty board or association.	HLT, CPC
HB 1797 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Authorizes naturopathic physicians to provide written certification to qualifying patients for medical cannabis use.	HLT, CPC, FIN

HB 1619 Status	RELATING TO PENAL RESPONSIBILITY. Authorizes the courts to enter into collaborative agreements to divert into residential, rehabilitative, and other treatment those defendants whose physical or mental disease, disorder, or defect is believed to have become or will become an issue in a judicial case.	HLT, JUD, FIN
HB 1620 <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE. Amends the effect of finding a defendant charged with a misdemeanor or petty misdemeanor not involving violence or attempted violence unfit to proceed. Amends the requirements for fitness determination hearings, court-appointed examiners, and examination reports.	HLT, JUD, FIN
