HB 1661, HD1 (HSCR3-20) Status RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, JUD

Amends the definitions of "dangerous to others" and "dangerous to self" to include the refusal to take psychiatric medication or undergo mental health treatment such that self-inflicted violence or violence to

others is probable. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (HD1)
