SB 2429 RELATING TO HEALTH. CPH/HMS, WAM

Provides medical assistance for pregnant women in certain Status & Testimony

SB 2459 RELATING TO MEDICAID BENEFITS. CPH/HMS, WAM

Makes an appropriation to restore certain adult dental benefits Status & Testimony

to medicaid enrollees. Requires maximization of federal

matching funds.

SB 2563 RELATING TO DEMENTIA TRAINING. CPH/HMS, WAM

Requires the departments of health and human services to Status & Testimony develop and provide dementia training to first responders and

investigators from DHS's adult protective services program.

SB 2025 RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS. HMS/CPH, JDC

Permits minors over fifteen years of age to consent to medical Status & Testimony

care related to the diagnosis or treatment of HIV or the prevention of HIV.

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. HMS/CPH, WAM **SB 2248**

Requires DHS to establish a neighbor islands blind and visually Status & Testimony

impaired service pilot program to provide services and training for blind and visually impaired neighbor island residents.

Appropriates funds. Repeals 06/30/2021.

SB 2324 RELATING TO MEDICAID. HMS/CPH, WAM

Beginning January 1, 2021, requires contracted health plans Status & Testimony

under the State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs to cover routine costs of care of enrollees

participating in an approved clinical trial.

RELATING TO LONG TERM CARE. **SB 2333** HMS/CPH, WAM

Requires the executive office on Aging to report the Status & Testimony

assessment of progress toward the reported goals and state recommendations going forward; appropriate funds for one

fiscal year to the executive office on aging.

RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

HMS/CPH, JDC

Clarifies the allowable relationships the caregiver must have to be considered related to a child in care: clarifies that a program that provides exclusively for a specialized training or skill development shall be for children who are eligible pupils in grades kindergarten through twelve in public or private schools: clarifies that minimum health and safety requirements or standards as required by federal law may be imposed on any of the groups in section 346-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that provide child care for a child whose family receives a child care subsidy from the department; clarifies that the burden of proof is upon the caregiver or facility to provide verification of meeting a declared exemption under section 346-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes; clarifies that the information that may be investigated by the department to determine violations of part VIII of chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, occurred or is occurring; clarifies that the department may file a petition for a search warrant with the district court; clarifies that a search warrant may be issued to the department and the appropriate law enforcement agency to conduct an investigation; and renumbers the exemptions to appear as they were prior to Act 276, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019.

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HMS/CPH, WAM

Requires the Department of Human Services, upon approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, to establish and implement a program for providing home- and community-based services to at-risk individuals having intellectual or developmental disabilities who meet certain criteria. Requires the department to utilize any vehicle available, including a state plan amendment or waiver to the QUEST integration section 1115 demonstration project to provide home- and community-based services for individuals having intellectual or developmental disabilities. Appropriates funds.
