<u>SB-2128, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR3071)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION. Requires the builders of new dwellings to provide buyers with information on the benefits and costs associated with installing and maintaining a residential fire sprinkler system. Requires the State Fire Council and the Executive Director of the Office of Consumer Protection to develop a standard form for this purpose. Effective 1/2/2050. (SD1)	HSG, CPC, FIN
<u>SB-2206, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3078)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates funds for capital improvement projects consistent with the purposes of the rental housing revolving fund. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, FIN
<u>SB-2214, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3225)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Requires state or county agencies to issue discretionary permits for housing development projects that meet certain requirements within sixty days of receipt of a permit application deemed to be complete by the receiving state or county agency. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, FIN

<u>SB-2625, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3202)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Establishes an Affordable Homeownership Revolving Fund within the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to provide loans to nonprofit housing development organizations, and community development financial institutions for the development of affordable homeownership housing projects. Makes an appropriation into and out of the Affordable Homeownership Revolving Fund. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, FIN
<u>SB 2695, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3389)</u> Status	RELATING TO HOUSING. Creates the housing incentive fund to be administered by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority. Allows the fund to be seeded with general obligation bonds. Establishes an income tax credit for individuals or corporations who contribute to the fund. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, FIN
<u>SB-2817, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2965)</u> Status	RELATING TO WASTE. Requires cooperative housing corporations and unit owners! associations of high rise condominium properties to provide at least one waste cooking oil receptacle in an easily accessible location on the property to allow residents to deposit grease and waste cooking oil. (SD1)	HSG, FIN
<u>SB 2852, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3218)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HOUSING LOAN AND MORTGAGE PROGRAM. Increases the Hula Mae Multifamily Revenue Bond authorization ceiling amount to continue financing affordable rental housing statewide. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, FIN
<u>SB 3062, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3116)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE TAX. Removes the dollar amount cap to be paid into the rental housing revolving fund from state conveyance tax revenues. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, FIN
<u>SB 3142, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2989)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST PUEO DEVELOPMENT, LLC. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for a master planned development proposed by Pueo Development, LLC. (SD1)	HSG, FIN
