Requires the chief of police in a county issuing a firearm permit to

conduct a mandatory review of an applicant's mental health records.

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

JUD/PVM

Status

Prohibits any person from possessing a loaded firearm while

intoxicated, unless the person is in their own dwelling. Violation is a

petty misdemeanor.

HB 2736

RELATING TO FIREARMS AMMUNITION.

JUD/PVM

<u>Status</u>

Requires the licensing of sellers of ammunition, and for the identification and proper permitting of purchasers or possessors of ammunition. Regulates ammunition in the same manner that firearms

are regulated.

#### **DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW**
