HB 2017 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION.

JUD, FIN

Allows the Hawaiian homes commission or the department of Hawaiian hone lands to retain independent legal counsel as needed. Authorizes the Hawaiian homes commission and the department of Hawaiian home lands to use the services of the attorney general as needed and when the interests of the State, Hawaiian homes commission, and department of Hawaiian home lands are aligned. Provides that funds paid to independent legal counsel shall be paid by

the State.

HB 2378 Status

RELATING TO VACANT AND ABANDONED RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURES.

JUD, FIN

Requires counties to expedite demolition permits for vacant and abandoned residential homes. Allows the department of taxation to seek sale of the property through non-judicial foreclosure of vacant and abandoned residential properties with outstanding recorded state tax liens at any time after establishing vacancy and abandonment.

HB 1793 Status	RELATING TO THE COMMISSION ON SALARIES. Requires the commission on salaries that convenes in 2024 to make salary recommendations for the following eight fiscal years. Provides for the executive, judicial, and legislative branch salary recommendations to become effective on the same date beginning on July 1, 2033.	JUD, FIN
HB 2288 Status	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES. Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees.	JUD, FIN
HB 2650 Status	RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING OR REPEALING VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES OR THE SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII FOR THE PURPOSES OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, CLARIFYING LANGUAGE, OR DELETING OBSOLETE OR UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Amends or repeals various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes or the Session Laws of Hawaii for the purposes of correcting errors and references, clarifying language, or deleting obsolete or unnecessary provisions. RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

HLT, CPC, FIN

(HSCR26-20) Status

Authorizes the Department of Health to implement a program for wholesale importation of prescription drugs. Effective 7/1/2050.

RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE TAX.

CPC, FIN

Status

Requires that the certificate of conveyance filed with the director of taxation include the names and addresses of limited liability company

officers, directors, and members or managers.

HB 1860, HD1

RELATING TO WATER POLLUTION.

EEP, CPC, FIN

(HSCR6-20) Status

Adds the chemicals homosalate, octocrylene, and octisalate to the sale and distribution sunscreen ban beginning on 1/1/2021. Allows the

Department of Health to adopt rules to add additional harmful chemicals to the sale and distribution ban. Effective 7/1/50. (HD1)

HB 1864, HD1 (HSCR7-20)

Status

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Amends the definition of renewable portfolio standard to be a percentage of electrical energy generation, rather than sales. Amends the renewable portfolio standard interim goals for 2030 and 2040 to

accelerate the adoption of renewable energy. Effective 7/1/2050.

<u>HB 2102</u>

RELATING TO HEMP PRODUCTS.

CPC, FIN

Status

Requires labels on hemp products. Prohibits unwarranted health-related statements about hemp products. Establishes standards for hemp food product manufacturers. Establishes that a product shall not be considered adulterated or misbranded solely by the inclusion of hemp. Clarifies that a licensed medical cannabis dispensary is not prohibited from manufacturing, distributing, or selling products that contain hemp, or cannabinoids, extracts, or derivatives from hemp.

RELATING TO TOWING.

Status

Clarifies meaning of existing statute relating to towing of abandoned vehicles by adding definitions; requires tow and storage companies to accept credit cards; includes penalties consistent with unfair practices per Section, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

HB 2202

RELATING TO CEMETERIES.

CPC, FIN

Status

Allows any cemetery authority to be exempted from licensing, bonding, and fee requirements when selling or offering use of its property or portion thereof for the inurnment of cremated remains of

its members, adherents, and their families.
