Provides that the right to a contested case hearing is deemed waived if a person does not request a hearing within 20 days of receipt of the commission's preliminary determination. Permits an order of the commission to be confirmed as a judgment in the circuit court, giving the order the same force and effect as any other judgment issued by the

circuit courts; provided that there shall be no appeal from the

judgment.

HB 2237 Status

RELATING TO DRUG DISPOSAL.

Establishes the Drug Disposal Program, administered by the Department of the Attorney General, to dispose of prescription and over-the-counter drugs in a safe, secure, and environmentally friendly manner. Establishes the Drug Disposal Special Fund and appropriates

funds.

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **January 30, 2020**. No public testimony will be accepted.

HB 1741 Status

RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT.

JUD, FIN

Amends the offenses of sexual assault in the first and third degree, when perpetrated against someone who is mentally defective, to remove the standard of proof regarding knowledge that the other person was mentally defective, as that term is defined in section 707-700, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

HB 1742 Status RELATING TO ABUSE OF A FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD

MEMBER.

Amends the penal code to add abuse of a family or household member

to felonies that qualify for repeat offender sentencing.

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.
