<u>SB 2868, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR3247)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO QUALIFIED DOMESTIC RELATIONS ORDERS. Amendments to clarify benefits to alternate payees, advisory review determinations of Hawaii Domestic Relations Orders and the priority of multiple orders. Effective date 7/1/51. (SD1)	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 2402, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR3278)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Authorizes a court to order the forfeiture of Employees' Retirement System benefits of an ERS member, former member, or retirant upon conviction of the individual for a felony related to the State or county employment of the individual. Authorizes designated beneficiaries to receive ERS benefits upon the death of the ERS member, former member, or retirant convicted of the felony. (SD2)	LAB, FIN

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SB 2866, SD2 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN (SSCR3193) BENEFITS TRUST FUND EMPLOYEE-BENEFICIARY Status **MONTHLY CONTRIBUTIONS.** Amends section 87A-40, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to mandate that new retired employees pay their share of health benefits premiums through monthly electronic deductions from their Employees' Retirement System pension or their financial institution. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) SB 2842, SD2 RELATING TO EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT. LAB, FIN (SSCR3395) Revises emergency procurement laws to add equipment failures, Status repairs to public property to protect against further loss of, or damage to, public property, to prevent or minimize serious disruption in continued functioning of government services. Replaces approval by chief procurement officer with an accounting report to the Legislature within 60 days after the procurement is made. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. SB 2843, SD1 LAB, FIN (SSCR3323) Changes the amounts to be posted for a protest bond from a flat fee for contracts under \$1,000,000 to a percentage of the estimated value of Status 5 the contract. Increases the percentage for contracts with estimated value of \$1,000,000 or more. Repeals the cap on the maximum amount of the protest bond. Adds a sunset provision. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1) SB 3015, SD2 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. LAB, FIN (SSCR3063) Makes an appropriation to the Department of Accounting and General Status Services for the purposes of funding training, development, and consulting services for innovative project delivery. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) SB 3143, SD2 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. LAB, FIN (SSCR3105) Requires the State Procurement Office and the Public Works Division Status of the Department of Accounting and General Services to develop a ten year pilot program to enable innovative methods of procurement.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Establishes an exempt innovative project delivery officer position within the Public Works Division. Makes an appropriation. Repeals
