<u>SB 3029</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Increases the maximum fine that may be assessed per fireworks-related violation from \$2,000 to \$5,000, provided that the fireworks violation does not otherwise have a specific penalty enumerated in chapter 132D, HRS.	PSM, JDC
<u>SB 3076</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL. Appropriates funds to add 1.0 FTE program director and 1.0 FTE staff member, and to provide for employment training, materials and supplies, and other costs associated with the state building code council and with establishing an office.	PSM, WAM
<u>SB 3148</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO FACE SURVEILLANCE. Limits the government use of face surveillance except in certain circumstances. Limits the private use of face surveillance unless the subject of the face surveillance has given consent.	PSM, JDC
