Status

Prohibits the operation of a helicopter for commercial purposes without a valid instrument rating from the Federal Aviation

Administration. Subject both a violating individual and an individual's

employer to penalties.

HB 1950

Status

RELATING TO AN UNDERWATER TUNNEL AND SUPPORTING ROADWAYS TO PROVIDE A MORE DIRECT CONNECTION

G TRN, FIN

BETWEEN EWA AND DOWNTOWN HONOLULU.

Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a private-public partnership to design, build, and operate an underwater tunnel for vehicle traffic to provide a more direct connection between Ewa and downtown Honolulu along with the expansion of roadways as necessary to maximize use of the tunnel.

Authorizes general obligation bonds. Appropriates funds.

HB 890 Status RELATING TO THE PM ZIPPER LANE.

TRN, FIN

Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study that reevaluates the costs and feasibility of constructing a zipper lane along

the H-1 freeway in the westbound direction for use during the

afternoon hours.

<u>HB 2461</u>

RELATING TO TRAFFIC CONGESTION.

TRN, FIN

Status

Requires the Department of Transportation in collaboration with other public agencies, to research and develop methods to reduce traffic

congestion and motor vehicle fuel emissions in the State.

RELATING TO THE IGNITION INTERLOCK PROGRAM.

Status

Requires that an ignition interlock device not have recorded a negative
