RELATING TO SAND ISLAND.

state recreation area. Appropriates funds.

Makes it a civil and administrative violation for any person to engage in certain archeological activities without obtaining the required

permission or approval from the department of land and natural

resources.

RELATING TO SHARK PROTECTION.

Prohibits and establishes fines and penalties for knowingly capturing, taking, possessing, abusing, entangling, or killing any shark within

state marine waters. Provides certain exemptions.

RELATING TO WATER RIGHTS.

Status

Clarifies the disposition of water rights made by lease.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

If during the course of the hearing it appears there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three-minutes. This three-minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.
