SB 2448 RELATING TO BEES. WTL/PSM, WAM

Status & Requires any public facility or entity that receives state or county funding and discovers a beehive or swarm on its property to contract with a beekeeper for removal and destroy the beehive

only as a last resort.

SB 2779 RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ECOSYSTEM WTL/PSM, WAM

Status & RESTORATION COMMISSION.

Testimony

Establishes an ecosystem restoration commission to identify lands for environmental remediation and return ownership and

control of those lands to the State, a county, or other entity.

SB 2911 RELATING TO BOATING REPORTS. WTL/PSM, WAM

Status & Requires the fire chief and the ocean safety director of each county, in addition to the Director of Public Safety and the police chief of each county, to transmit to the Department of Land and

Natural Resources a copy of every report relating to boating accidents or the theft, loss, or recovery of vessels. Requires all reports submitted pursuant to section 200-27, Hawaii Revised

Statutes, to be unredacted.

SB 2759 RELATING TO TRAILS. WTL/PSM, JDC

Status & Testimony

Requires government entities that engage in search and rescue operations to seek reimbursement when the rescued person required search and rescue efforts because that person acted in

disregard of that person's safety, including intentionally disregarding a warning or notice. Increases the penalty for unlawfully entering or remaining on a trail that has been closed

to the public.

SB 2828 RELATING TO WATER. WTL/PSM, JDC Specifies that fire safety use is a beneficial use of water. Status & Requires the department of land and natural resources to work Testimony with the county governments, Hawaii emergency management agency, and owners to use reservoir water for fire safety. **SB 2667** RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCESS. PSM/WTL, WAM Provides that where public access is required as a condition of a Status & subdivision, either the county must accept dedication of and **Testimony** maintain the access or identify an entity to own and maintain the access. Authorizes the county to require the subdivider to establish a stewardship fund for maintenance purposes.
