HB1782 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION.

Limits the convictions that may be used in employment decisions from all convictions in the most recent ten years to felony convictions that occurred in the most recent five years and misdemeanor convictions that occurred in the most recent three years.

HB1783 RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

WLH, JUD, FIN

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish a citizen complaint intake process and prepare related informational material for dissemination and posting. Clarifies that failure to comply with certain advisement or approval processes shall constitute a violation of chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Authorizes the State Historic Preservation Division to issue an order to stop work immediately in the event of a failure to comply with certain advisement or approval processes. Makes any violator responsible for the costs of any site inspection and any recommended mitigation or restoration measures. Increases the maximum civil and administrative fines for violations of historic preservation review requirements. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to maintain and publish a list of certain violators. Authorizes the expenditure of moneys in the historic preservation special fund for certain costs relating to the enforcement of chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

HB1784 RELATING TO LANDOWNER LIABILITY.

Codifies into Hawaii's existing notary public law relevant portions of the Revised Uniform Law on Notarial Act, including provisions to allow notarial acts utilizing electronic documents with electronic signatures and seal, without requiring the signatory to be physically present before the notary public.

RELATING TO PHARMACEUTICAL REPRESENTATIVES. HB1804

HLT/IAC, CPC,

Requires pharmaceutical representatives to register with DCCA. Creates a program within DCCA for the administration and enforcement of pharmaceutical representative registrations.

Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. HB1805

HLT, CPC

FIN

Requires drug manufacturers to notify prescription drug benefit plans and pharmacy benefit managers if a proposed increase in the wholesale price of certain drugs would result in a sixteen per cent or more price increase over a two-year period. Requires the drug manufacturer to identify and report to the insurance commissioner information on certain drugs whose wholesale acquisition cost increases by a certain amount during a specified time frame.

Establishes the licensure and regulation of dental therapists.

Clarifies the scope of practice for licensed physical therapists to include the practice of dry needling. Expands other competence related activities to include certain dry needling specific

knowledge.

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. HB1808

TRN, FIN

Addresses the disposition of salvaged motor vehicles by authorizing the county directors of finance to issue certificates of ownership and salvage certificate to expedite the disposal of the

vehicles under specified circumstances.

HB1809 RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

IAC, CPC

Prohibits residential contractors from offering to pay, in any monetary form, a homeowners insurance deductible as an incentive to encourage the homeowner to hire the contractor. Allows an insured to rescind a contract to repair or replace roof systems or other exterior work within five business days of receiving notice from a homeowners insurer that all or part of the claim or contract is not a covered loss under an homeowners insurance policy.

HB1810 RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

PVM/TRN, JUD,

FIN

Authorizes the PSD sheriff division to inspect shipping containers at commercial harbors or work sites. Establishes the shipping container inspection program and shipping container inspection program special fund. Increases the maximum fine for each violation of the fireworks law. Requires PSD to submit reports to the legislature on implementation of the shipping container inspection program. Appropriates funds.

HB1811 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR F

THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTY-EIGHTH

REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the thirty-

eighth representative district.

HB1812 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TRN, JUD

Specifies that the driver's license of a civilian employee or civilian contractor of the United States Department of Defense that expires while the employee or contractor is stationed outside the United States remains valid for ninety days after the employee or contractor returns to the United States.

HB1813 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TRN, JUD

Authorizes the examiner of drivers to accept driver's license renewal applications from civilian employees and contractors of the federal Department of Defense more than six months prior to the date of expiration under certain conditions.

HB1814 RELATING TO THE IGNITION INTERLOCK PROGRAM. TRN, JUD

Requires that an ignition interlock device not have recorded a negative report for ninety consecutive days before it can be

removed.

HB1815 RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES. TRN, JUD

Permanently authorizes the Department of Transportation under certain conditions to designate shoulders upon which the Department may authorize the driving of motorcycles.

<u>HB1816</u> RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSG/HSH, FIN

Includes in HHFDC's homebuyers' club program a requirement to provide financial aid to participants. Requires DHS to offer long-term case management for low-income individuals and families and individuals and families that are formerly homeless or currently at-risk for homelessness and accept financial aid for rent. Appropriates funds.

<u>HB1817</u> RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

HSG, FIN

Authorizes issuance of \$200,000,000 in general obligation bonds and appropriates funds for capital improvement projects consistent with the purposes of the rental housing revolving fund.

HB1818 RELATING TO BICYCLES.

TRN, JUD

Requires all individuals operating a bicycle to ride within a bicycle lane whenever a bicycle lane is available for use, except in certain situations. Provides for the assessment of fines for each violation.

HB1819 RELATING TO HEMP.

AGR, JUD, FIN

Requires the State to seek approval from the federal Department of Agriculture of a state plan to monitor and regulate hemp. Establishes a statutory framework to monitor and regulate hemp. Establishes and appropriates funds for the hemp regulatory special fund. Excludes hemp from the State's prohibitions against marijuana. Appropriates funds to the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources at the University of Hawaii for hemp research.

HB1820 RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY

DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

WLH, FIN

Amends the nominating authority of the representatives of the Heeia community development district, Kalaeloa community development district, and Kakaako community development district on the Hawaii community development authority.

HB1821 RELATING TO DECLARATORY JUDGMENTS.

JUD

Prohibits declaratory judgments when there is a cause of action and in other certain instances. Requires a plaintiff to show a personal stake in the actual controversy beyond a general disagreement or complaint by requiring a showing of an injury-

in-fact.

Beginning July 1, 2020, requires the design of new state building construction to allow for the building to be a net zero capable structure, use post-industrial carbon dioxide mineralized concrete where cost-effective, have 25% of its accompanying parking lot be electric vehicle charger ready, and account for projected costs of utility bills when making decisions about the most cost-effective building design. Requires public buildings to be benchmarked beginning on July 1, 2021, and requires benchmarking data to be maintained by the Hawaii state energy office in a publicly available format. Requires equipment and systems to be assessed for energy efficiency every five years.

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to adopt rules to protect herbivorous fish in all state waters.
