Chair Baker, Vice Chair Chang and Members of the Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection and Health; I am pleased to give my strong support for the reappointment of Katherine Finn Davis, PhD, RN, APRN, CPNP-PC, FAAN to serve on the Health Planning Council, Honolulu Subarea. I had the pleasure of meeting Dr. Davis initially in 2015 and began my work with her in 2016 when she began working in a tri-appointment as the Director of Community Relations for the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene, Associate Director for Evidence-Based Practice at the Hawai'i State Center for Nursing and Nurse Researcher at the Queen's Medical Center.

In her Center for Nursing work, she engages nursing and interprofessional care teams in development of evidence-based practice, research and quality improvement through education, coaching and long-term mentorship, among many other undertakings. Aloha Senator Baker, I am honored to have been re-appointed to the Health Planning Council, Honolulu area (HONSAC). I am eager to serve my community in any way I can. Below are my responses to the required questions.

#### (1) Why do you want to be a member of the Board?

I currently serve as Co-Chair for the HONSAC. I am eager to continue as a member of the Health Planning Council, Honolulu Subarea as I feel that my expertise in the healthcare arena and my commitment to community service could continue to benefit the Council. I also very much enjoy the opportunity to serve in the location where I live and work to improve quality of life for Hawai`i residents.

(2) What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the Board?

The roles and responsibilities include being an active listener to learn about broad health needs and advocate for our community. Our Council is focused on elder care, so we are particularly sensitive to issues that we hear about through our jobs or other outlets that affect our kupuna. As members, we have a responsibility to work as a team to achieve common goals and to bring each of our individual areas of expertise to the table when determining issues to take on and how to best address them.

(3) In what ways do you feel that you can help protect the consumer?

Given my extensive experience in healthcare and skills applying evidence to practice, I can protect the consumer by ensuring that any endeavors that the HONSAC implements will be evidence-based and current with healthcare trends and scope.

(4) Given your understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Board member, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise and knowledge that would aid you as a member of the Board.

In my professional life I hold many prominent positions. I am Director for Community Partnerships at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene, Associate Director for Evidence-Based Practice Programs at the Hawai'i State Center for Nursing, and Nurse Researcher for The Queen's Medical Center. This broad base allows be to interact with healthcare providers and the community across the state to learn about what the most important healthcare needs are at the time. I have over 25 years of experience as a pediatric nurse, nurse practitioner, and researcher so am well versed in health promotion and disease prevention. I am also a national leader in evidence-based practice, able to bring evidence to any problem at hand and explain the science to any member who is unfamiliar.

(5) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

My hope is to participate in the Council's activities in a meaningful and contributory way so that we may achieve the goal(s) we set for ourselves. We are currently working on a series of Public Service Announcements (PSAs) for medication safety and adherence for our community dwelling kapuna.

(6) Name three qualities that best describe you and how these qualities will benefit the Board.

I am persistent, evidence-based, and a team player. I work well in groups to determine the strengths of each member and to encourage them to use that strength to contribute to the team's collective efforts. I will bring the most current evidence to the table as we discuss healthcare issues. I am also a person who always sees a project through to the end.

(7) Name a previous experience you've had that will be beneficial as a Board member.

I have had the position of Director for Community Partnerships for the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene for the past 3.5 years. This experience has allowed me to meet community members both healthcare affiliated and otherwise from around the state. I feel that this experience gives me a broad perspective of the community of interest. For the past 25 years, I have served as a nurse, nurse practitioner, and researcher all of which give me a vast background in healthcare issues. I have also served as Co-Chair for the HONSAC for the past 6 months, so am getting experience with leadership of this Council.

(8) Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interest that could arise during your service on the Board? How would you overcome conflicts of interest?

I do not foresee any conflicts of interest. If a conflict arose, I would discuss it with Karen Ho, SHPDA representative, and the Chair of the Council.
