In **SUPPORT** of GM 765, Manuel Kuloloio Relating to the Aha Moku Advisory Committee

The Hawaii State Aha Moku Advisory Committee (AMAC) stands in strong support of Gubernatorial Nominee, GM Manuel Kuloloio for consideration and confirmation to the Aha Moku Advisory Committee, for a term to expire on June 30, 2024.

Manuel Kuloloio is a life-long natural and cultural resource expert who intimately knows about the distinct historic natural characteristics of Kahoolawe from his kupuna, the Kuloloio 'Ohana. His great-grandfather was the spiritual and cultural expert who gave the place names, each with a specific reason, to the ahupua'a of Kahoolawe. All of that knowledge was passed on by his kupuna, is held now by Mr. Kuloloio, and will be passed on to his own descendants.

In the physical world, Mr. Kuloloio was the lead sweeper and inspector of ground surface and unexploded ordnance clearance when the military left the island to the Hawaiians in the 1990's. Mr. Kuloloio has been involved consistently with Kahoolawe since the early 1990's.

Because of his impressive lineage and connection, both spiritually and physically to Kahoolawe, Mr. Kuloloio has been handed down, and has accepted his kuleana to Kahoolawe – a kuleana that allows his irreplaceable expertise to be shared with all.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure. We are honored to have him as a member of AMAC who maintains his kuleana for his island and for his people.

Comments:

My comments on this nomination is not directed at the nominee but rather at the process for which nominations were provided to the legislature.

The Aha Moku Advisory Committee Final Rules of Practice and Proceure adopted by the Department of Land and Natural Resources, effective October 20, 2016, provides for the process for nominations. Part 1, section 1-2 states:

"The committee shall consist of eight members appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate from a list of nominations submitted by the 'aha moku councils of each island. Oversight of the committee shall be by the chairperson of the board of land and natural resources. The committee members shall vote for the committee chairperson and vice-chairperson from among its members."

My question is, did the Governor provide his list of nominees from a list submitted by the Aha Moku Councils? If not, these nominations cannot be supported by the legislature based on procedure alone.

This will be a comment that I repeat for each nominee under each GM number.
