SUBMITTING FOR CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE NATURAL AREA RESERVES SYSTEM COMMISSION, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, ANGELA HILLEI KAWELO, FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 06-30-2024

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 780, nominating Angela Hi'ilei Kawelo to the Natural Area Reserves System Commission for a term to expire June 30, 2024.

Pursuant to Section 195-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), the Natural Area Reserves System Commission (Commission) shall: (1) Establish criteria to be used in determining whether an area is suitable for inclusion with the reserves system; (2) Conduct studies of areas for possible inclusion within the reserves system; (3) Recommend to the Governor and the Department areas suitable for inclusion within the reserves system; (4) Establish policies and criteria regarding the management, protection, and permitted uses of areas which are part of the reserves system; (5) Advise the Governor and the Department on any matter relating to the preservation of Hawaii's unique natural resources; (6) Develop ways and means of extending and strengthening presently established preserves, sanctuaries, and refuges within the State; (7) Advise the Department and other public agencies managing state-owned land or natural resources regarding areas under their respective jurisdictions which are or may be appropriate for designation as natural area reserves; and (8) In carrying out the above duties, consult the most comprehensive up-to-date compilation of scientific data on the communities of natural flora and fauna of Hawaii.

Ms. Angela "Hi'ilei" Kawelo has extensive background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices. She is the Executive Director of Paepae o He'eia, a non-profit dedicated to

In <u>SUPPORT</u> of GM 780, Angela Kawelo Relating to the Natural Area Reserves System Commission

The Hawaii State Aha Moku Advisory Committee (AMAC) stands in strong support of Gubernatorial Nominee, GM Angela Hi'ilei Kawelo for consideration and confirmation to the Natural Area Reserves System Commission (NARS), for a term to expire on June 30, 2024.

A native Hawaiian, Angela Kawelo, more commonly known as Hi'ilei is an accomplished lecturer, historian and cultural practitioner. This is the mandate of the NARS as well – "to preserve in perpetuity land and water areas which support communities, as relatively unmodified as possible, of the natural flora and fauna, as well as geological sites of Hawaii". Hi'ilei Kawelo has already fulfilled this mandate as she has managed He'eia Fishpond as its Executive Director since 2007. Under her direction, she teaches ancient and proven ways to feed the communities of Ko'olaupoko even as she consistently regenerates conservation and sustainability.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure. We believe Angela Hi'ilei Kawelo is meant to be on the Natural Area Reserves System where she can share her expertise and cultural history with others.

The Administration of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) will recommend to the Board of Trustees a position of <u>SUPPORT</u> for GM780, which nominates Angela Hi'ilei Kawelo to continue her role as a member of the Natural Area Reserves System (NARS) Commission.

The NARS Program carries out vital parts of the state's responsibilities to conserve, protect, and manage our natural and cultural resources, and specifically works to preserve representative samples of Hawai'i's diverse biological systems for study and appreciation by Hawai'i's residents, including Native Hawaiians. Among other activities, the NARS Commission provides recommendations on the selection and treatment of areas to be included in the NARS program.

The NARS Commission has historically included experts in various fields of environmental science, as well as representatives from the hiking and hunting communities; since 2013, the NARS Commission has also required one member to have demonstrated experience, education, or expertise in Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices. OHA supported the inclusion of this latter membership requirement, in order to provide the Commission with insight as to the cultural value and significance of existing and potential future natural area reserves, as well as the many cultural resources and sites they may contain — insight which is particularly important given the responsibilities of all state agencies to protect and enforce the rights of Native Hawaiians, and to fulfill the state's interest in perpetuating Native Hawaiian culture and values.

Ms. Kawelo has demonstrated expertise and experience not only in the traditional and customary restoration, management, and protection of loko i'a, but also possesses an extensive personal and familial background in the stewardship of the natural and cultural resources and sites of He'eia, Kahalu'u, and adjacent ahupua'a in the moku of Ko'olaupoko, O'ahu. She has also demonstrated a lifelong commitment to the protection and perpetuation of native species, cultural resources, cultural sites, and Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices throughout the islands, as reflected in her numerous awards and recognitions, as well as her service on various government and nonprofit groups such as Kua'āina Ulu 'Auao, Sea Grant

Hawai'i, Papahana Kuaola, Hui Ulu Mea 'Ai, Mana Maoli, and the Kāne'ohe Marine Life Advisory Council.

Ms. Kawelo's continued membership on the NARS Commission will accordingly enable her to continue fulfilling the vision underlying the establishment of a seat for a Native Hawaiian cultural expert, in informing the Commission with respect to the cultural value and significance of existing and future reserves, and ensuring that NARS Commission decisionmaking can accommodate or even perpetuate Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices consistent with the state's legal and moral obligations to Native Hawaiians and the public trust.

Accordingly, OHA urges the Committee to **PASS** GM780. Mahalo nui for the opportunity to testify on this measure.
