Illegal fireworks cause havoc on Maui every year. It's not uncommon for fireworks to be exploded nightly from Halloween until after New Year's. Our dogs are traumatized by the noise, the air is polluted by the smoke, and the debris left behind in the streets from these illegal fireworks being set off runs into the storm drains and into the oceans.

The Maui Police do not seem to enforce existing laws against illegal fireworks because they do not patrol my neighborhood where they could see and hear violations. Instead, they say the "chase [fireworks] calls" but never seem to make any arrests. The police need to get out of their cars and patrol the problem neighborhoods on foot [or better yet, on bicycle] in order to be present when the violations are occurring and be able to take enforcement action. I know from my own prior law enforcement experience that this tactic works, but the local police do not seem able to work proactively against the problem.

The flow of illegal fireworks must therefore be stopped when they are shipped into the state. Greater efforts should be made to detect and intercept these shipments. Further, the existing laws against illegal fireworks need to be properly enforced.
