HOUSE BILL NO. 1103 HD2 RELATING TO THE PESTICIDE SUBSIDY PROGRAM

Chairperson Luke and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill 1103 HD2, relating to the Pesticide Subsidy Program. This bill will appropriate money to the Hawaii Department of Agriculture to continue the pesticide subsidy program established under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014. The funds will be used towards assisting coffee farmers on Hawaii Island, Maui, and Oahu to control the coffee berry borer and mitigate the damage it causes to the coffee beans. The Department supports this measure and requests an amendment.

Invasive species are a primary threat to Hawaii's agriculture and economy. The coffee berry borer is a significant coffee pest in Hawaii and the world. The additional funds will allow the Department to continue to support coffee farmers through the duration of the program. The Department requests that this funding be a general fund appropriation and not be placed into the pesticide use revolving fund.

Aloha Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen, and Members of the Committee:

I am Brian Miyamoto, Executive Director of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawaii Farm Bureau supports HB 1103, HD2, which appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture for the pesticide subsidy program

Coffee is one of Hawaii's signature crops; one that helps bring fame and tourists to Hawaii. Coffee Berry Borer (CBB) threatens the entire Hawaiian coffee industry. While the full tally is yet to be made, farms on Hawaii Island have experienced deep losses. Some have failed. Moreover, large quantities of coffee have been downgraded due to insect damage, reducing the value of the remaining crop. CBB is a serious threat to Hawaii's agriculture industry and the state's economy. While CBB is battled worldwide, no other coffee growing origin shares Hawaii's high labor costs and restrictions on pesticides that may be used elsewhere to fight this destructive pest. This places the industry at a competitive disadvantage when compared to the rest of the coffee-growing world.

Fighting CBB is a priority in other coffee-producing countries. The USDA has expressed its support targeted toward research, education and mitigation. The industry's response has been immediate and multi-faceted. A non-profit CBB task force has been formed, including growers, processors, HDOA, UH, USDA and county government. CTAHR and HDOA have been responsive and effective in their combined efforts. Industry has committed countless private sector dollars and has leveraged both State and Federal funds. The State must continue to do its part.

A recent CTAHR economic analysis estimates FY2013 crop losses due to CBB at \$7.68 million, with a resultant \$571,000 annual loss in state tax revenues. The extension of the CBB Pesticide Subsidy Program should be viewed as a modest investment one of the state's largest and most important agricultural industries.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure of great importance.

Aloha Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen and members of the Committee,

I am Chris Manfredi, President of Hawaii Coffee Association.

The Hawaii Coffee Association's (HCA) mission is to represent all sectors of the Hawaiian coffee industry, including growers, millers, wholesalers, roasters and retailers located throughout the State of Hawaii. The HCA's primary objective is to increase awareness and consumption of Hawaiian coffees. A major component of HCA's work is the continuing education of members and consumers.

The HCA strongly supports HB 1103 HD1. The Hawaiian green coffee industry is valued at more than \$62MM by USDA - not accounting for retail sales. The advent of Coffee Berry Borer (CBB) in Hawaii has threatened our industry to its core. Working together with commodity groups, HDOA, UHCTAHR, USDA, Hawaii Farm Bureau, SHAC, CBB Task Force, lawmakers, administrators, countless volunteers and stakeholders, together, we averted the collapse of Hawaiian coffee - one of Hawaii's signature crops.

The recent discovery of CBB on Maui is alarming to many of our members. Were it not for the support of the legislature via HDOA Pesticide Subsidy Program aimed at controlling Coffee Berry Borer, many more farms would have failed - with resulting unemployment, loss of revenue and potentially becoming a burden to the state. Moreover, abandoned farms act a reservoir for the pest, affecting neighboring farms, reducing crop yields and increasing the cost of control. HB1103 HD 1 represents a modest investment in the Hawaiian Coffee Industry - one that also contributes to tourism.

The cost of production of coffee in Hawaii is generally much higher than any other coffee growing region. The high cost of land, labor, transportation, farm inputs, and regulatory compliance place Hawaii's producers at a competitive disadvantage to our counterparts located beyond our shores. In many instances the cost of CBB management is far less expensive. While we are working as an industry to effect meaningful change in this area, the HDOA subsidy program helps level the playing field for Hawaii's producers.

Thank you for your support of HB 1103 HD1 and for the opportunity to testify on this important measure.
