We STRONGLY OPPOSE HB1184 for it is an anti-choice bill which would interfere with women's health decisions which should be left with a woman and her doctor. HB1184 could affect the rare cases where there is a severe fetal anomaly or a periviable/non-viable pregnancy where the family decides to end the pregnancy by labor induction and provide comfort measures to the neonate rather than futile resuscitation.

HB1184 mirrors the anti-choice legislation that has been used in other states by the religious right and has no place in Hawaii.

Planned Parenthood Votes Northwest and Hawaii ("PPVNH") writes in strong opposition to H.B. 1184, which seeks to add harsh criminal penalties against medical providers in an attempt to discourage them from treating patients and prevent women from accessing safe, medically appropriate care. This measure is nothing more than another political attempt to criminalize abortion and curtail access to safe, legal reproductive health care.

This bill is unnecessary and intentionally designed to politicize the provision of health care. Planned Parenthood physicians provide high-quality medical care and adhere to the most rigorous professional standards, including providing emergency care.

- Medical guidelines and ethics already compel physicians whose patients face life-threatening circumstances to respond.
- Doctors and clinicians oppose this law because it prevents them from giving the best care to their patients. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists strongly opposes this type of legislation, calling it "gross interference in the practice of medicine."

This is just another attempt to push an agenda that undermines people's access to safe, legal abortion. Yet again, anti-abortion politicians are seeking to advance their extreme anti-women's health agenda.

- This legislation is part of a broader agenda against women's access to health care, accurate information, and bodily autonomy.
- This bill is intended to be inflammatory and is crafted by politicians who are trying to criminalize doctors' medical care.
- Politicians at the state level have passed nearly 400 restrictions on abortion since 2011. This is all a part of the same effort.
- Politicians, not doctors, are pushing for this restriction, which undermines the ability of health care professionals to provide individualized care that's right for each patient.

Undermining access to safe, legal abortion is wildly out of touch with the majority of Americans. Politicians are putting women's lives at risk to score political points through these dangerous measures strongly opposed by the majority of Americans.

- Support for Roe v. Wade is the highest ever, with seven out of 10 Americans saying they believe a woman should have the right to safe, legal abortion that's more popular than Congress, the Republican party, or the Democratic party.
- Anti-women's health politicians are demonstrating they are out of touch with the majority of voters.

The decision about if and when to become a parent should be up to a woman and her doctor. These decisions are deeply personal – we can't pretend to know a woman's circumstances or make those decisions for her. What we do know is that we must trust women to make these decisions. Please support Hawaii women's access to safe, medically appropriate health care and vote no on this horribly misguided bill.

Dear Chair Mizuno and Vice Chair Kobayashi and members of the Committee,

This anti-choice legislation has been used in other states in situations that come up very infrequently, and would criminalize doctors providing safe and effective medical care. This dangerous bill is part of a coordinated national strategy to eliminate access to abortion, and could actually affect those rare cases where there is a severe fetal anomaly (or a periviable/non-viable pregnancy) where the family decides to end the pregnancy by labor induction and provide comfort measures to the neonate rather than futile resuscitation.

HB 1184 adds harsh criminal penalties against medical providers in an attempt to discourage them from treating patients and thus, prevent women from accessing safe, medically appropriate care. This measure is nothing more than a political attempt to criminalize abortion and curtail access to safe, legal reproductive health care.

This bill is unnecessary and intentionally designed to politicize the provision of health care; disrupting high-quality medical care decisions made between a patient and her doctor.

- Medical guidelines and ethics already compel physicians whose patients face lifethreatening circumstances to respond.
- Doctors and clinicians oppose this law because it prevents them from giving the best care to their patients. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) strongly opposes this type of legislation, calling it "gross interference in the practice of medicine."

This is just another attempt to push an agenda that undermines people's access to safe, legal abortion.

- This legislation is part of a broader agenda against women's access to health care, accurate information, and bodily autonomy.
- This bill is intended to be inflammatory and is crafted by people who are trying to criminalize doctor's medical care.

We are strongly opposed to HB1184. This bill is a thinly veiled attempt to subvert the human rights of the women of Hawaii.

Aloha Chair Mizuno, Vice Chair Kobayashi and members,

This bill that is a creature of the religious right is unnecessary and full of inflammatory language designed to politicize a standard medical procedure. We have seen at the national and local level horrific stories about infants being aborted and tortured or sold. These stories upon critical examination have turned out to be fabricated, like much of the info-trash that is clogging the Internet.

It is once again an attempt by certain religious sects to impose their systems of belief on women as a matter of law. Last I checked we don't live in theocracy. But while the "Handmaids Tale" once looked like a dystopian fantasy, efforts like this make the possibilities chillingly real.

The so-called "right to life" people focus on horror stories about babies as a slight of hand, deflecting attention away from women who used to die terrible and painful deaths as a result of illegal abortions. It deflects attention away from the fact that women are being treated as human incubators who, in their view, should have no say over what happens to their own bodies.

It obfuscates the real motives of these patriarchal institutions which is the exercise power and control over women. So just like physical rape is not about sex, it's about degradation, power and control, so too this rape of the spirit is also about degradation, power and control.

So here's some truth for you. Religious hospitals of a certain persuasion continue to prioritize a fetus over the life the woman and would let her die in order to "preserve life".

Elizabeth Sepper, a health law scholar at Washington University in St. Louis had this to say "In many states, if a Catholic hospital were to kill a woman because they did not provide her with proper miscarriage management, they would not face liability," Sepper noted. "It's one thing to say, in order to protect one's religious beliefs and convictions about when life begins, we're going to allow you to step away from a situation, to not perform an abortion in most situations. But to say that you could actually kill someone or seriously injure them and face no consequences for that seems a step too far."

And Huffington Post reports "There isn't much of an incentive for staff at Catholic hospitals to challenge the scope of the church's directives, since doing so could result in being punished. A nun who was an administrator at a Catholic hospital in Arizona was excommunicated in

2010 after she approved an abortion for a patient who probably would have died if her pregnancy had continued." $^{\rm 1}$

So it is clear that this bill is just another attempt to marginalize women, deprive us of healthcare and even aid and abet some of our deaths.

Bottom line: HB 1184 attempts to criminalize and intimidate abortion providers.

Medical guidelines and ethics <u>already</u> compel physicians whose patients face life-threatening circumstances to respond. Doctors and clinicians also oppose this law because it prevents them from giving the best care to their patients.

This is just another attempt to push an agenda that undermines women's access to safe, legal abortion. Undermining access to safe, legal abortion is wildly out of touch with the majority of Americans. Hawaii state legislators are putting people's lives at risk to score political points through these dangerous measures strongly opposed by the majority of Americans.

As a section of the Nation's leading group of physicians dedicated to improving health care for women, the Hawai'i Section of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (HI ACOG) represents more than 200 obstetrician-gynecologist physicians in our state. **HI ACOG strongly OPPOSES HB1184** as it would actually **threaten the health of women in Hawai'i**.

If the intent of this legislation is to protect the health of infants, this legislation does not do anything close to that. What this bill will do is reduce access to a safe and legal procedure - and that is its actual intent. This bill has been used in other states as part of a larger effort to reduce access to abortion.

<u>We</u> are the physicians who care for patients in some of their happiest moments, and in some of their most heartbreaking moments. Anyone familiar with abortion procedures knows that this law is not based on any scientific or medical facts. This bill addresses a "problem" that does not exist.

<u>We</u> are physicians who provide compassionate, evidence-based care. By criminalizing health care providers, this law may actually reduce the number of health care providers (not just the surgeons, but anesthesiologists, nurses, midwives, office staff) willing to provide this care. But again, that is the actual intent of this bill. Reducing access to safe abortion care would threaten the health of women in Hawaii.

<u>We</u> are the physicians who care for patients when they find out that their very wanted, very loved baby has severe fetal anomalies. Families sometimes choose to end the pregnancy and provide their baby with palliative care rather than subject their baby to any suffering or futile efforts at resuscitation. These families face very difficult decisions about what their values are and what is best for their family; decisions that none of us has a right to make for them or judge them for. What they need in these moments is compassion and medically accurate information from health care providers free of judgement or politics.

HI ACOG therefore stands in strong opposition to HB1184 and respectfully urges you to <u>not</u> pass this harmful and deceptive piece of legislation.

As the physicians who provide this medical care, we stand by ready to answer any questions or provide any factual and evidence-based information regarding abortion care. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

I am an physician who provides High-Risk Pregnancy care in Hawai'i. I am passionate about providing compassionate care to women in our state and I am writing with STRONG OPPOSITION TO HB1184.

I care for many patients who are diagnosed with lethal fetal anomalies during their pregnancy. Fortunately in the state of hawaii, if these anomalies are deemed lethal by two physicians, they have the ability to provide compassionate end of life care for the fetus. Continuing the pregnancy to go to full term can often cause problems for the mother for an infant that will not survive. Trying to prolong the life of these infants is harmful and not in line with physician principals of doing no harm. Instead, palliation through termination of pregnancy is an important part of compassionate care. Even for patients that may not have the diagnosis of a lethal anomaly, comfort care instead of intensive, expensive medical care is a compassionate option for parents, and this bill will not allow for patient choice in this matter. Some women may choose to continue the pregnancy or they may choose to end the pregnancy and give their baby comfort care instead. It should be their choice. These women and their families face decisions no one should have to make; decisions about what their values are and what is best for their family; decisions that none of us has a right to make for them or judge them for. What they need in these moments is compassion and medically accurate information from health care providers free of judgement or politics.

Hawai'i has a strong and proud history of protecting the right to choose and protecting the privacy of this sometimes painful decision. This law flies in the face of this and would be a step backward for Hawai'i. This is not who we are. We are better than this.

I strongly oppose HB1184 and respectfully urge you to not pass this harmful and deceptive piece of legislation.

My name is Beverly Look. I am a retired business agent for the HGEA. My husband, Wallace, was a resident of Leahi Hospital until he passed in January of last year. The treatment my husband received as a resident was exceptional. Words cannot convey the gratitude my family and I have for the way he was treated by the staff of Leahi Hospital. This is a positive reflection on the hard work that has been and continues to be performed by the Oahu Region Board in administering the region's facilities.

I strongly oppose House Bill 1539 which seeks to place the Oahu Region of HHSC under the control of the corporate board.

In 1999, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation ("HHSC") was established under Section 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"). The operations and functions of the state Department of Health Division of Community Hospitals were transferred to the HHSC.

In response to the unique healthcare challenges being faced by each of the regions, the legislature in 2007 passed Act 290 (Session Laws of Hawaii), which amended Section 323F, enabling the five HHSC regions to establish five regional health systems with boards of directors, while still maintaining the system and corporate board.

In 2009, the legislature passed Act 182, SLH, again amending Section 323F, HRS, in an effort to strengthen the viability of the public-hospital system through organizational and operational changes, in addition to providing the regions with authority to transition into various legal entities.

The purpose of these amendments was to ensure that members of each regional board would be sensitive to, and make decisions based on, the needs and concerns of the community in which they live. This bill effectively seeks to deprive Oahu residents of the opportunity to make independent, community-based decisions on what is best for Oahu by abolishing the Oahu Region Board and transferring its authority to an 18-member corporate board dominated by people from the neighbor islands.

Furthermore, the fact that the Oahu Region Board is singled out while Kauai, West Hawaii and East Hawaii boards remain intact smacks of political chicanery. I have strong reservations about the HHSC corporate board and management overseeing the operations of the Oahu region when it has trouble overseeing its own senior management. In May of 2016, the Hawaii State Ethics Commission issued a charge (COMPL-C-15-00650) against the Chief Financial Officer of HHSC for violating the State Ethics Code. This person occupies a position of trust and oversees how millions of taxpayer dollars are spent every year. The Commission entered into a resolution of charge with this individual, resulting in the payment of a \$1,000 administrative penalty. (Resolution of Charge 2016-7) To my knowledge, this person didn't even get a slap on the wrist by the HHSC corporate board and management, and according to the HHSC corporate website still occupies the same position. This proposed legislation will give this person even greater authority over the finances and how money is spent within the Oahu region.

In closing, I wish to again express my strong opposition to House Bill 1539. Leave the Oahu Region Board in place to address the needs and concerns of the people on Oahu.

In these cases, where death is likely before or shortly after birth, patients may decide whether to continue the pregnancy or end the pregnancy – in some instance families may elect to induce labor and provide compassionate care, rather than resuscitation. This bill would mandate resuscitation rather than compassionate care and would not allow a family to grieve in a way they see fit. Our focus must be to provide medically-appropriate, compassionate care for the patient, honoring what she feels is best for her health and her family.

Sound health policy must be based on scientific facts and evidence-based medicine. The best health care is provided free from political interference in the patient-physician relationship. This is clearly an anti-choice piece of legislation that would grossly interfere in medical practice criminalizing health care providers who seek to honor the wishes of their patient.

Regarding HB 1184 RELATING TO BORN ALIVE INFANTS, I oppose this bill. When a woman chooses to pursue a medical procedure to terminate her pregnancy that is a very personal and complicated decision. Hawaii State Legislators are not empowered by the U.S. Constitution, nor are they, in my opinion, sufficiently qualified, to override personal choice for women who make the decision to pursue the medical procedure of abortion. Pregnancy is not an incapacitating condition and a woman who makes the choice to get an abortion, which is legally her right, should not then be subjected to second-guessing by society or ignoring of her difficult and considered decision. Society is not prepared, sufficiently funded, nor wise enough to discern for an individual whether the option to select abortion is "right" for an individual, and has no sufficient plan for dealing with the complex sustainability or quality of life considerations that may occur in the rare instance when an aborted fetus displays residual cellular or nervous system reactivity extra-uterine.

A second concern related to the proposed bill is that it functions to force a woman into "adoption" of her fetus. The emotional nuances and mental health concerns this then places on the woman who had selected to terminate her pregnancy are ethically fraught, at best. These are areas over which legislators are not qualified to make judgments on behalf of myself or other women who may opt to terminate a pregnancy.

A third consideration is to criminalize a well-established medical procedure and place health care professionals in legal jeopardy for discharging their medical duties. Hawaii has a physician shortage, as it is, and this would further reduce incentives for qualified medical staff to choose our state for their practices.

Finally, the U.S. Constitution, Article XIV clearly states that, "No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws." Specifically, the relevant case law would be the U.S. Supreme Court's decision on "Rowe vs. Wade", confirming that abortion is legal and a woman's right to select the medical procedure to which she would like to submit is a personal liberty. To pursue HB 1184 is a "feel-good" moral stance without credible likelihood of being a well-reasoned or well-defended position in front of the U.S. Supreme Court, the inevitable conclusion to such a folly as passing a bill such as this.

I would much prefer to see the tax dollars from the citizens of the State of Hawaii applied to practical problem solving in our own back yard rather than supporting such a misinformed, ill-conceived and unsupportable legislative initiative that is doomed to be mired in court challenges for decades to come.

I urge legislators to NOT support HB 1184.

The CDC reported in 2015, that 91.9% of abortions are performed within the first 13 weeks of pregnancy. 7.6% in the second trimester (14-20 weeks) and 1.3% in the third trimester (21 weeks). For 9 out of 10 women who have an abortion, they are able to do so within the first trimester of their pregnancy. For a moment, let us consider why a woman might have a late term abortion at 21 weeks or later. First, a commonly cited reason for those who are pro choice say late term abortions do not always occur under the life threatening health or medical conditions or if the fetus will be lethally flawed. Consider the position of this woman if she did have a condition, or the fetus would have no quality of life. How would aborting a child at this stage make you feel? That decision does not come any easier for her. How would you feel if you were forced to carry a child to term that you knew would never have a chance at life, or that would take yours? Everyday you literally cannot escape the reminders. You are force to literally carry it with you-inside of you. Consider the psychological and physical toll it must take on her and her body. The one out of ten women who may have a late term abortion do NOT wake up one day and think to themselves, "Well, I'm in the 3rd trimester now I think I'll abort the fetus." What other sociopolitical or economic factors might prevent her from being able to access the care and services she needs sooner? Racial/ ethnic, socioeconomic class, cost, insurance, location, providers, feeling safe, laws by state, etc. Restricting abortion laws only make it significantly more difficult for those women who would like to seek safe, legal, and trust worthy advice about her options sooner and easier. If you would like to restrict abortion I strongly advice you to consider the reasons a woman would ever be put in the position to consider having one. If you are pro-life, I assume you are also pro contraceptives, comprehensive sexual education, healthcare access that would cover the fundamental basic reproductive services with very little to no out of pocket costs so abortion does not, or ever, have to be an option.

Vapor Products Are Not the Same as Tobacco: They Contain No Tobacco and Often NO Nicotine. Vapor products and e-liquids contain NO tobacco, and often contain NO nicotine at all. They emit NO smoke, only water vapor and yet this bill tries to deceptively refers to vapor

products as "Electronic Smoking Devices". It is misleading to the public and wrong by definition. Vapor products are not the same as tobacco products and should be viewed, controlled,

and talked about differently than traditional tobacco products. They are fundamentally different from tobacco products in every way, and many of its users use them because they are less harmful and different.

Studies Show That They Are Being Used to Curb Traditional Smoking Rates: Vapor Products are not the same as tobacco products, and thus, should not be regulated in the same fashion. Vapor products have not been demonstrated to have the same detrimental effects of combustible tobacco products and have otherwise been shown in recent studies to be as much as 95% less toxic than traditional cigarettes.

A recent CDC report has shown e-cigarettes have supplanted all other traditional nicotine replacement therapies and are now the most commonly used product by consumers to quit using traditional tobacco cigarettes. Restricting Delivery Is Only Going to Hurt Local Business

HB 387 would place restrictions on shipments of vapor products to only licensees and would thus act as a ban on Internet sales & purchases by the public and would be unenforceable. This would not successfully remove vapor products from the Internet. It would simply restrict local businesses from competing with businesses from the 49 other states and countries around the world who would not be subjected to this law. Internet sales provide access to vapor products for many local customers who live in remote locations. By restricting local Internet retailers, those purchases would simply be sent to mainland based suppliers or even worse, would force those people who do not have easy access to vapor products to return to smoking.

I am writing in STRONG OPPOSITION to HB276.

Any regulation of flavors should occur at the federal level - Congress empowered FDA to establish tobacco product standards such as restricting flavors only if FDA determines that such action would be appropriate for the protection of the public health based on science and evidence.

Potential Harm Reduction Should Be Considered - E-vapor category is relatively new, some public health and tobacco control researchers have reached the preliminary conclusion that e-vapor products may present a compelling risk reduction opportunity compared to combustible cigarettes. Mitch Zeller, Director of the Center for Tobacco Products at FDA, along with many scientific experts, has recognized the promise tobacco harm reduction and potentially reduced risk products may hold for public health. In a recent letter to the World Health Organization, 53 global experts on nicotine policy stated that policies that are excessively restrictive or burdensome on lower risk products can have the unintended consequence of protecting cigarettes from competition from less hazardous alternatives and cause harm as a result. In a recent survey of 4,618 e-vapor consumers, almost half of participants said that a lack of variety of flavors would make reducing or completely switching from smoking cigarettes less likely.

Approximately 90% of adult e-vapor consumers report using flavored products.9 Hawaii should respect the preferences of adult consumers to use flavored products, especially when they could play a role in reducing tobacco-related harm. We believe regulators and legislators should tailor public policies to reflect the uniqueness of this category, including the fact that these products emit vapor, not smoke.

A ban on characterizing flavors could contribute to the growth of the "Do-It-Yourself" DIY involves purchasing separately, and then mixing, liquid nicotine, propylene glycol, glycerin, and flavors to make an e-liquid for an open device. Details on how to mix flavors and liquid nicotine are readily available online. Materials for DIY – some of which are of unknown quality and origin – are inexpensive and widely available. FDA has not yet explored issues raised by the separate sale, and home-mixing, of nicotine and flavorings.

21 Age Restriction Already in Place. Hawaii already has put a 21 and older ban on sales of vapor products in place. Kids should not use any nicotine product and access to such products, including those with characterizing flavors. No manufacturer should use children's cartoons or youth-oriented candy trademarks to market their products. When its rulemaking is final, FDA will have comprehensive authority over the sale and marketing of all tobacco and tobacco-derived nicotine products. This authority includes the ability to take further action as required to prevent illegal underage purchase.

This ban would essential destroy the vapor industry as all flavors - even the "natural tobacco flavor" mentioned in the bill are the results of flavoring. This means all vapor products would be illegal if this bill passes. I am sure this is not what you meant to do with this bill, and its result would mean the lose of my business and creation of a black market and increased online sales of unregulated products.

This bill will affect greatly to our continuing growing frail and vulnerable elderly population who need twenty-four hour professional care on Oahu. With the HHSC Board, their interest is based on their own agenda (financial aspects and benefits of the HHSC body) instead of the well-being of the frail and vulnerable elderly population.

Leahi and Maluhia hospitals have been serving the frail and vulnerable elderly population who require care in their activities of daily living for over 50 years. Leahi and Maluhia provide skilled nursing and long term care and are well known among the community. Their adult day health program enables families with frail and vulnerable elderly (who require assistance with part of activities of daily living, such and toileting, meal preparation, showering, ambulation, and feeding) to continue to work and know that their loved ones are being taken care of.

I have been working at Leahi & Maluhia since 1999. The majority of the residents who live in Leahi and Maluhia are Medicaid participants and usually are first or second generation immigrants. As the gap widens between the rich and the poor, Maluhia and Leahi have been a place for those in need. If a corporate board would oversee the Oahu region in the future and did not have any vested interest, how could we serve this population who need care?

Is the removal of the Oahu Region Board and transfer to the HHSC Board the only solution? Why do other regions (Kauai, Maui, East Hawaii & West Hawaii) have their own boards and yet Oahu falls under HHSC jurisdiction?

I am very troubled regarding the passage of this bill and the constant changes in the health care system in our country. I am hoping that the care of the elderly at Leahi and Maluhia continue to be supported. I am a physician working at the University of Hawaii, John A. Burns School of Medicine, Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Women's Health. I provide comprehensive obstetrics and gynecology services and teach medical students, residents and fellows how to provide compassionate, scientifically-based, women's health care. My views are my own and do not represent those of the University of Hawaii. I am writing in strong opposition of HB 1184.

This proposed bill is based on the false claim that infants are "born alive" at the time of an abortion. Those of us with scientific knowledge and medical training know that this is not how abortions occur. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and other national professional organizations recognize that bills that criminalize abortion limit access to safe, evidence-based, reproductive health care.

What this bill would do is harm people who are experiencing pregnancies with fetal anomalies. The few abortions that do occur later in pregnancy involve fetal anomalies that incompatible with life, anomalies that would result in death during or shortly after birth. In these cases, families are faced with the difficult decision to continue a
pregnancy or end a pregnancy, and may choose to induce labor and provide palliative, compassionate care rather than resuscitate their newborn that has no chance of survival. This bill would mandate that medical providers provide resuscitation and would not allow for families to choose to grieve their loss in a way that befits their values. As healthcare providers, our goal is to provide evidence-based medical care for patients in line with the decisions they think are best for their health and their family.

Health policies must be based on the best medical evidence that allows patients to make the decisions that are best for themselves and their families and allows healthcare providers to support patients in those decisions to the best of their medical ability, free from the fear of political interference based on false claims. This piece of anti-choice legislation will negatively impact pregnant women, their families, and the healthcare providers who care for them.

Based on my knowledge and expertise as a physician, I strongly oppose this bill and urge the legislature to stop this bill from advancing any further.

I am a physician working at the University of Hawaii, John A. Burns School of Medicine, Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Women's Health. I am board certified in Obstetrics and Gynecology and Maternal Fetal Medicine. I teach medical students, residents and fellows how to provide compassionate, scientifically-based, women's health care. My views are my own and do not represent the University of Hawaii where I am an Associate Professor. I am writing in absolute opposition of HB 1184.

My first thought when I read this bill, is "You know not of what you speak". In the practice of Maternal Fetal Medicine, I am on the front lines counseling with families who are expected to make the most difficult decisions any person can face regarding severe fetal abnormalities and or delivery that occurs and the threshold of viability through no fault of anyone. Many severe fetal anomalies are not compatible with life after birth. A large part of my job is to assist families make the best decisions that they can for themselves and their fetuses/newborns based on sound medical evidence and the ethical principles of beneficence and autonomy.

We are obligated as medical care providers to honor the ethical principle of beneficence. Beneficence means do what is in the best interests of our patients and to do no harm. Autonomy allows the patient to make her own decisions for herself and her newborn, even if she has decided to end the pregnancy or the decision is made for her by natural processes. These principles support the choice to allow comfort care for an extremely premature or severely anomalous newborn if life saving measures are considered futile by the opinions of the health care provider and family. There are limits to what medical science can do to resuscitate and prolong the life a newborn that is extremely premature or severely malformed, much the same way that there are limits to what can be done at the end of life.

Often, the best choice a family can make in a futile situation is comfort care. Comfort care allows the newborn to pass in the comfort and peace of her parent's arms. Resuscitation is physically painful and separates the newborn from the parents. A breathing tube is put down the throat of a newborn that may be too small to accommodate the smallest tube. Needles are poked into tiny abdomens, arms, and legs. Chest compression (CPR) easily and often break tiny ribs and bruise skin. A government body cannot and should not regulate decisions about resuscitation. This belongs in the realm of the provider patient relationship. The proposed bill is a privacy (HIPPA) violation and insinuates that families and providers make such decisions casually and without guidelines. This assumption cannot be farther from the truth. Our

professional organizations and our hospitals have well thought out and evidence-based guidelines surrounding termination of pregnancy that serve the needs of women within the law as it already exists. It is short sighted and dangerous to label medical decisions made between a provider and patient as criminal.

Secondly, the proposed bill is based on the myth that infants are "born-alive" at the time of abortion. This is not medically accurate. Highlighting this as a problem, is sensationalism designed to frighten the public. Those of us who are knowledgeable in women's health understand that this is not how abortions occur. Multiple national organizations including the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists recognize that the proposed bill is another attempt to criminalize abortion and curtail access to safe, legal reproductive health care.

HB 1184 should not be passed and is harmful to the families of Hawaii.

What the proposed bill would do is adversely affect pregnancies affected by severe fetal anomalies. Many abortions that occur later in pregnancy involve fetal anomalies incompatible with life, such as anencephaly, the absence of the brain and cranium above the base of the skull, or limb-body wall complex, when the organs develop outside of the body cavity. In these cases, where death is likely before or shortly after birth, patients may decide whether to continue the pregnancy or end the pregnancy – in some instance families may elect to induce labor and provide compassionate care, rather than resuscitation. This bill would mandate resuscitation rather than compassionate care and would not allow a family to grieve in a way they see fit. Our focus must be to provide medically-appropriate, compassionate care for the patient, honoring what she feels is best for her health and her family.

I am an Obstetrics and Gynecology resident at the University of Hawaii, John A. Burns School of Medicine. I provide comprehensive women's health care to my patients at multiple hospitals. This care includes but is not limited to abortion care. I am writing in strong opposition of HB 1184.

The proposed bill is based on the myth that infants are "born-alive" at the time of abortion. This is not medically accurate. Those of us who are knowledgeable in women's health understand that this is not how abortions occur. Multiple national organizations including the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists recognize that the proposed bill is another attempt to criminalize abortion and curtail access to safe, legal reproductive health care.

I recently took care of a patient who broke her water bag when she was only 4 months pregnant. As this was a strongly desired pregnancy she and her partner were heartbroken. They asked if anything could be done to save her pregnancy and wept when we told her that at this early gestational age, there was nothing we could do. She elected for a medication abortion and received pills to help her uterus contract. When her tiny 18 week old son was delivered, she and her husband held him and held each other. All of the staff left the room so they could have their alone time. They were able to grieve and spend their first and last moments with their son in peace and quiet. Although a difficult process, they were thankful for the care they received and hope to try again soon.

If this proposed bill went into effect, imagine how this scenario would unfold. Instead of being allowed to grieve and hold their son, this couple would have had to have him quickly taken away, had to watch futile resuscitative efforts, watch their room become swarmed with a huge medical team, and, in the end, most likely their son would have still passed or his suffering would have been unnecessarily prolonged. Our focus as healthcare providers must be to provide medically-appropriate, compassionate care for the patient, honoring what she feels is best for her health and her family.

Dear Senator Mizuno and Senator Kobayashi,

I am submitting this testimony in opposition to House Bill 1184, A Bill for an Act Relating to Born Alive Infants, which would provide civil and criminal penalties to any physician, nurse, or other healthcare providers who, after performing an abortion procedure, fail to administer life-saving treatments to a "live birth" fetus, and the parent(s) or guardian(s) if they attempt to conceal the "birth" of the fetus.

The definition used in the act regarding a "born alive" infant includes "a heartbeat," which, can occur as early as the seventh week after conception (Hutchinson, 2019, 57). It also includes "definite movement of voluntary muscles," which can occur as early as the twelfth week after conception (Hutchinson, 2019, 57). In studies done by Marilee C. Allen et al. (1993) and by Gary D. V. Hankins MD et al. (2013), they identified the lower limits of fetal viability between twenty-two and twenty-five weeks gestation. Both of these limitations fall well before the scientifically identified range of gestation weeks during which a fetus could survive outside of the womb and even at twenty-two weeks, many fetuses did not survive to become toddlers.

The Center for Disease Control's (CDC) Abortion Surveillance 2015 reported that only 1.3% of abortions were performed at twenty-one weeks or more gestation and that most occurred before fourteen weeks gestation. Similar numbers were reported in the documentary "Reversing Roe" (2018). In the documentary, they described how many women went to the former president, Bill Clinton, and talked to him about how their abortions saved their lives and helped with their mental health.

With so few people having abortions after the limit of fetal viability and the definition in this Bill being as ill-defined and non-factually-based as it is, I protest the passage of this Bill and the criminalization of abortions. I urge the committee to oppose H.B. No. 1184. Thank you for your time and this opportunity to testify.

I am writing in strong opposition of HB 1184. As a maternal-fetal medicine specialist, I have devoted my career to taking care of women with high-risk pregnancies. This means that every day at work I strive to provide high-risk mothers and their babies with the best outcome possible within current medical limitations.

It is therefore with this experience and understanding that I know that the proposed bill will have perhaps unintended, but nevertheless devastating effects on some families. There are too often tragic situations in which it is known that the child, once born, has very little or no chance to survive for very long. In these situations we allow families to choose the care they would like for their newborn after birth. In many of these situations, families, understandably, choose comfort care. Comfort care is treatment that aims to keep the child comfortable while allowing the family to hold and spend time with their child rather than pursing invasive and often painful interventions that attempt to prolong life in the setting of a dismal prognosis and separates the family from their child.

Resuscitation, though often live-saving, is not completely benign. It involves aggressive measures – multiple needles and catheters, CPR that may break ribs in a tiny chest wall, a breathing tube. Again, in cases where the prognosis for the child is very poor, it is not acceptable to force families, or create the perception among providers that families need to be forced to accept these interventions if they are not going to make a difference in the ultimate outcome for their child.

I write to you with over twenty years of experience in not only providing reproductive health care, but teaching this care to medical students, residents and fellows. And I write to you in **STRONG OPPOSITION TO HB1184**.

This is a bad bill. If the intent of this bill is to protect the health of infants, this legislation does not do anything close to that. It is based on a myth that infants are "born alive" at the time of abortion. Anyone who knows anything about abortion knows that this is not a thing. This is not based on any medical or scientific fact. In addition, the language on how health care providers would comply with this law are vague. And that is purposeful. Because let's be clear – scaring health care providers who provide abortion is the actual intent of this bill. Therefore, what this bill will actually do is reduce access to a safe and legal procedure. This bill has been used in other states as part of a larger effort to curtail access to abortion.

I repeat, <u>this bill will not protect the health of infants</u>. The patients who will end up suffering because of this bill are patients for whom medical complications occur in either the baby or the mother. Have you ever had to tell a woman who finally got pregnant after years of trying that her baby has a severe medical condition and will die either prior to delivery or soon after? I write to you with almost 30 years of experience in not only providing prenatal care and duagnosis, but teaching this care to medical students, residents and fellows. And I write to you in STRONG OPPOSITION TO HB1184.

This is a bad bill. If the intent of this bill is to protect the health of infants, this legislation does not do anything close to that. It is based on a myth that infants are "born alive" at the time of abortion. Anyone who knows anything about abortion knows that this is not a thing. This is not based on any medical or scientific fact. In addition, the language on how health care providers would comply with this law are vague. And that is purposeful. Because let's be clear – scaring health care providers who provide abortion is the actual intent of this bill. Therefore, what this bill will actually do is reduce access to a safe and legal procedure. This bill has been used in other states as part of a larger effort to curtail access to abortion.

I repeat, this bill will not protect the health of infants. The patients who will end up suffering because of this bill are patients for whom medical complications occur in either the baby or the mother. My name is Jennifer Shishido and I am a mother of two strong, intelligent women and a grandmother to two wonderful, kind and somewhat rascally grandsons. I offer this testimony based on my experience and knowledge as a concerned citizen.

HB 1184, Relating to Born Alive Infants, is a sham and misleads the public into believing that the practice of allowing infants who survive a late term abortion to die by starvation or by the withholding of medical care is even occurring and requires additional government intervention. It is an attempt to enlarge and promote additional unnecessary and harmful amendments which chip away at Roe v. Wade.

We already have the federal Born Alive Infants Protection Act of 2002, PL 107-207, which renders this state bill unnecessary, except in the minds of those desiring to take away a woman's right to choose a safe and often necessary pregnancy termination.

First, late term abortions are exceedingly rare and are sought usually under very difficult circumstances for the parents – perhaps severe fetal genetic anomalies or extreme living conditions such as poverty or abuse.

Third, on the federal level, measures have been introduced to enlarge the protections of "survivors" of abortions which in actuality erode a woman's right to choose and remove many of the protections for doctors and nurses who provide compassionate care and already follow acceptable medical procedures. These measures are an attempt to fabricate horror stories about abortions, establish further unnecessary obstacles to obtaining safe abortions and to chip away at Roe v Wade.

The purpose of this Act is to ensure the protection and promotion of the health and well-being of all infants born alive as a result of an abortion performed in the state, to mandate that healthcare providers give medically appropriate and reasonable life-saving and life-sustaining medical care and treatment to all such born alive infants and to provide penalties for failure to provide medically appropriate and reasonable life-sustaining medical care and treatment to all such born alive infants and life-sustaining medical care and treatment to all such born alive infants.

Page 3, lines 2-12 (definition of live birth)

"Born alive" or "live birth" means the complete expulsion or extraction of an infant from his or her mother as a result of an abortion, regardless of the state of gestational development, that after expulsion or extraction, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached, shows and evidence of life, including, but not limited to, one or more of the following:

(1) Breathing;

(2) A heartbeat;

- (3) Umbilical cord pulsation; or
- (4) Definite movement of voluntary muscles.

I personally do not see anything offensive or controversial issue with this.

Some may ask what makes me think it is happening in Hawaii, since there appears to have been no reported cases.

I think that is a valid question. What comes to mind is the Kermit Gosnell case. Firstly the raid on his office had nothing to do with his performing abortions; it had to do with drugs. It was during this raid that the conditions of his clinic and what he was doing would come to light!

Note that this case was not based on abortion; he was prosecuted on what he did with those babies that survived the abortions he was performing.

I do not believe this is a right or left issue, a prochoice or prolife issue ... I believe it is whether or not we as a state, we as a people support or oppose Infanticide: the crime of killing a child within a year of birth.

By passing this bill we are making a statement to all, of Hawaii's sincere love and protection for our Keiki!

In closing I ask for your support in passing this bill.

We agree with the sponsors of the bill in their goal to protect and promote "the health and well-being of all infants born alive as a result of an abortion performed in the state, to mandate that healthcare providers give medically appropriate and reasonable life-saving and life-sustaining medical care and treatment to all such born alive infants and to provide penalties for failure to provide medically appropriate and reasonable life-saving and life-sustaining medical care and treatment to all such born alive infants." i

Between the years 2003 and 2014, the CDC reported that there were somewhere between 376 and 588 infant deaths (under the medical code P96.4 which keeps track of babies born alive) after a "termination of pregnancy." It concluded that of those 588 babies, 143 were "definitively" born alive after an attempted abortion and they lived from a few minutes to one or more days. In about 48% of the reported cases, the babies lived between one to four hours without being medically cared for. Most people would find that unacceptable.

It seems completely reasonable to do everything possible to save the life of a baby that survives an attempted abortion. Adding criminal penalties for anyone who recklessly and intentionally refuses to provide medical treatment in that circumstance is appropriate - especially when it falls well within the scope and responsibility of that medical professional.

The proposed Born Alive Infant Protection Act simply recognizes that babies born alive after an attempted abortion should be given the best medical care available and the full and equal protection of our laws.

The following are some of my reasons :

1. As I am a woman and a mother, I understand that during pregnancy, biological bodily changes automatically hapoen. The body changes during the 9 month period and we are programmed to support the pregnancy and act to protect, nurture and grow the fetus within. The later the stage of decision to abort, the more likely it is to harm the reproductive health of the mother. "[T]he United States Senate had an opportunity to unanimously declare to the nation that infanticide is objectively wrong. That they failed to do so is unconscionable. No newborn should be left to suffer or die without medical care. It is barbaric and merciless to leave these vulnerable infants without any care or rights." Hawai'i legislators can and should do what Congress was unable to do.

We strongly believe that infants who are born alive are persons and are entitled to the full protections of the law. Thank you for allowing me to share my heart on HB 1184 regarding born alive infants. I would like to share what I am in support of this measure to protect infants that have survived attempted abortions. The primary reason that I am in favor of this bill is that an infant living outside of the womb, whether that child was delivered on time, prematurely, or as the result of having survived an attempt at abortion, is a living, breathing human and entitled to the full range of medical care available to any other just-born infant. Dear Chair Mizuno, Vice-Chair Kobayashi and members of the committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on the measure before you. The Young Progressive Demanding Action (YPDA) board has unanimously voted to **oppose** HB 1184. YPDA respectfully asks that the committee defer the bill indefinitely.

HB 1184, the Born Alive Infant Protection Act, claims to ensure the protection and promotion of the health and well being of all infants born alive the State. It mandates medically appropriate and reasonable life-saving and life-sustaining medical care and treatment to all born alive infants and provides civil and criminal penalties. However, it does the opposite.

The decision to go through an abortion is a difficult one and should be made between a doctor and his or her patient. It is a sad decision for a woman to make, and their peers often shun women for making this decision. This bill creates a third party intrusion by the government on that decision, which is an invasion of their privacy.

The bill is also poorly written, there is no gestational age limit on the lower end so if a doctor who is saving a woman's life by operating on her to remove an ectopic pregnancy in her tube can be charged with second-degree murder if he/she doesn't keep that pregnancy alive. The state currently faces a doctor shortage crisis, the added pressure on doctors brought on by this bill would deter doctors from working in the state.

Should the committee move forward with HB 1184, we recommend the bill be heavily amended to include the following:

- Allocate an appropriate amount of money to fund childcare for every child up until the age of eighteen.

- Remove the penalties on doctors and nurses, due to the doctor shortage facing the State of Hawaii.

- Allocate an appropriate amount of money for each hospital in the state to purchase the proper equipment to move forward with this new law.

- Requires that the State of Hawaii fund all abortions.

As a section of the Nation's leading group of physicians dedicated to improving health care for women, the Hawai'i Section of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (HI ACOG) represents more than 200 obstetrician-gynecologist physicians in our state. **HI ACOG strongly OPPOSES HB1184** as it would actually **threaten the health of women in Hawai'i**.

If the intent of this legislation is to protect the health of infants, this legislation does not do anything close to that. What this bill will do is reduce access to a safe and legal procedure - and that is its actual intent. This bill has been used in other states as part of a larger effort to reduce access to abortion.

<u>We</u> are the physicians who care for patients in some of their happiest moments, and in some of their most heartbreaking moments. Anyone familiar with abortion procedures knows that this law is not based on any scientific or medical facts. This bill addresses a "problem" that does not exist.

<u>We</u> are physicians who provide compassionate, evidence-based care. By criminalizing health care providers, this law may actually reduce the number of health care providers (not just the surgeons, but anesthesiologists, nurses, midwives, office staff) willing to provide this care. But again, that is the actual intent of this bill. Reducing access to safe abortion care would threaten the health of women in Hawaii.

<u>We</u> are the physicians who care for patients when they find out that their very wanted, very loved baby has severe fetal anomalies. Families sometimes choose to end the pregnancy and provide their baby with palliative care rather than subject their baby to any suffering or futile efforts at resuscitation. This bill will have a direct impact on the lives of approximately 48,000 people living on the isolated Waianae coast with a single highway serving as the only entrance into and exit out of the community that extends from Nanakuli, through Maili, Waianae, Makaha and out to Kaena Point.

The East Hawaii Regional Board of HHSC offers the following comments on HB 1539.

The East Hawaii Regional Board (EHRB) is acutely aware of the escalating cost of healthcare and the financial pressures being experienced by the State of Hawaii. We recognize that each region must do all it can to reduce or minimize the growth of the general fund subsidy to HHSC.

We also recognize that the Oahu Region is unique both in the limited nature of its services and its location in the urban center of Honolulu. It is reasonable to expect that the recentralization of the Oahu Region and the combining of leadership structures currently located in the same facility will provide some efficiencies. We are confident that the HHSC corporate board and administrative leadership will be able to guide Oahu facilities in deciding how best to contribute to the adequate and cost effective provision of long term care services on Oahu.

With that said the EHRB is a fervent supporter of regionalization. The ability to exercise local decision making regarding our communities' health care has resulted in remarkable improvements to the quality and effectiveness of services provided to Hilo, Puna, and Ka'u. America's mission statement is "We The People" and when issues of abortion rights, access to medical care, paid family leave, immigration controls etc surface, the space in which We The People is important gets smaller. The HB1184 bill has no place in Hawaii and hopefully no place in the country.

This bill undermines people's access to safe, legal abortion and criminalizes doctors medical care.
