HOUSE BILL 1234, "RELATING TO Motor Vehicles"

TO: The Honorable Henry J.C. Aquino, Chair And Members of the Committee on Transportation

The City and County of Honolulu agrees with H.B. No. 1234 but would offer the following amendments:

Page 4, Line 10: Herein the law presently requires notification to the registered owner. The law additionally allows the registered owner to respond within 10 days from the date of notice. Failure to respond within 10 days of the date of notice results in the relinquishment of all claim to said vehicle. As Page 4, Line 9 reads the prior law would be contradicted such that we are now allowing owners a longer timeframe to reclaim their vehicle which subsequently nullifies the County's ability to expeditiously rotate a vehicle out of its inventory while respecting constitutional right to private ownership.

The City & County of Honolulu would offer that the legislation should mandate the implementation of a database of record (By no later than 2021) that serves to enable this legislation by tying in the personal information requested across four areas of relation: Driver's License, Motor Vehicle Registration, Traffic Citation Division, and Motor Vehicle Control (the entity that oversees the towing of abandoned vehicles).

Barring the implementation of an end-to-end software solution that bridges the gap between the above four areas of service the net result will be a disconnected system with a higher than likely probability of establishing a piece of legislation that will not result in operational impact and subsequent results.

I am Major Darren Izumo of District 5 (Kalihi) of the Honolulu Police Department (HPD), City and County of Honolulu.

The HPD supports the intent of House Bill No. 1234, Relating to Motor Vehicles, which requires an application for motor vehicle registration to include more detailed information and authorizes counties to assess a fine to the legal owner of a vehicle deemed abandoned.

The additional registration information would help in holding owners more accountable should they abandon their vehicle. Of concern though, from an identity theft standpoint, is the security and access to this detailed information. Also, in the experience of the HPD, many vehicles are abandoned due to the lack of a current registration and/or insurance. This could be a deterrent to legally dispose of an abandoned vehicle.

The HPD urges you to consider amendments to House Bill No. 1234, Relating to Motor Vehicles.
