Good afternoon Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen, and Members of the House Committee on Finance. Thank you for providing the Crime Victim Compensation Commission (the "Commission") with the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill 1351 HD1, Relating to the Department of Public Safety Operating Budget. House Bill 1351 HD1 provides funding for the operations of the Sherriff's Division and the Commission for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

The Commission was established in 1967 to mitigate the suffering and financial impact experienced by victims of violent crime by providing compensation to pay un-reimbursed crime-related expenses. Many victims of violent crime could not afford to pay their medical bills, receive needed mental health or rehabilitative services, or bury a loved one if compensation were not available from the Commission.

The Commission does not have any new requests for funding and appreciates that its budget request is already covered in House Bill 2 HD1, Relating to the State Budget. Thank you for your consideration and for your support of the Commission's work on behalf of Hawai'i's crime victims.

Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) **supports** the passage of House Bill (HB) 1351, House Draft (HD) 1, which appropriates funds for the Department of Public Safety's (PSD) Sheriffs, PSD 503 and Crime Victim Compensation Commission (CVCC), PSD 613.

HB 1351, HD 1 reflects the additional budget requests for FB 2019-21 for PSD 503. (CVCC does not have any additional funding requests.) The Department greatly appreciates the House Committee on Judiciary's provision of the additional requests for:

- 1. Funds for Motor Vehicle Replacement
- 2. 4.0 Deputy Sheriffs for Oahu District for Homeless Operations
- 3. 6.0 Clerk Dispatchers II for Sheriff Airport Detail

PSD has reviewed HB 1351, HD 1 and notes that the request for 15.0 Deputy Sheriff positions to staff the new mauka concourse of the Daniel K. Inouye International Airport was not appropriated. Although it was reported that the

construction would not be completed on schedule, the Department respectfully requests the Committee on Finance's consideration in appropriating this funding, due to the lengthy lead time required to recruit, hire, and train the new Deputy Sheriffs. New Deputy Sheriffs undergo a rigorous 6 months of Law Enforcement training and must become familiarized with the work environment in order to operate efficiently and effectively in their security role. Allocating the positions and funding through HB 1351, HD 1, would enable PSD to staff up, so that the Deputy Sheriffs will be ready to assume the necessary law enforcement duties at the new mauka concourse without delay. Attached is the Form A that details the request for 15.0 FTE, \$874,335 for FY 2020 and \$1,503,899 for FY 2021.

IV. JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

positions will be needed for the additional security requirements, patrols and emergency responses of the increased airport operating area. The Daniel K. Inouye International Airport is a Category X airport, the highest FAA classification for airports and is the main port of entry to the state. The positions are needed to meet the health safety and security requirements essential for facilitating a healthy state economy, taking care of adjacent businesses, the workers and traveling public. transportation of individuals. The jurisdiction of the Section is all DOT Airport property which includes Lagoon Drive and over 150 busineses adjacent to the airport proper, while the Airport Security Contractor is limited to the airport itself based on contract. The Sheriff Airport Detail also responds to calls for service and emgergencies at the not limited to, LE specific duties outlined in CFR 1542. Deputy Sheriffs can make on-view arrests, and by warrant, for criminal violations of Federal and State laws while Dillingham Airlield in Wallua and Kalaeloa Airlield in Kapolei. The Airport Detail also includes four (4) TSA Legacy Program Sheriff Canine Explosive Detection Teams. As part of a Multi-Agency Antiterrorism effort, these teams are responsible for screening all mail and most of the cargo that departs Honolulu on commercial carriers The Sheriff Airport Detail provides for Law Enforcement (LE) support to the traveling public and workers at the Daniel K. Inouye International Airport. To include but, as required by the TSA. The 2020 opening of the Mauka Concourse will add 12 new boarding gates and 4 new TSA Security Checkpoints.
