Dear Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen, and Honorable Members,

The Hawai'i State Commission on the Status of Women supports HB1355 HD1, which would appropriate funds to the Hawai'i State Commission on the Status of Women to offset one-time salary adjustments.

The Commission is the oldest commission of its kind – the very first state women's commission in the United States. The Commission was created in state law by the Legislature in 1970 to "aid in the implementation of its recommendations, to develop long-range goals, and to coordinate research planning, programming, and action on the opportunities, needs, problems, and contributions of women in Hawaii. It is the purpose of this chapter to provide for a statewide program, on a permanent and continuing basis, on the status of women in Hawaii." (HRS § 367-1)

For over 50 years, the Commission has served as the main consultant to policymakers and as the central clearinghouse for women's resources. The Commission has also been instrumental in coordinating the three county commissions on women, producing statewide research, and supporting community programs on the most marginalized issues affecting women and girls.

This measure is critical to maintain the Commission's budget by correcting and offsetting one-time salary adjustments that occurred in 2017 (Executive Director) and 2018 (permanent Secretary II) through unanimous vote by the Commission. An appropriation of \$18,888 would compensate for the salary adjustments. Accordingly, the Commission respectfully urges the Committee to pass this measure.


