In consideration of **HOUSE BILL 1410** RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES

House Bill 1410 proposes to add a member to the Board of Land and Natural Resources (Board) who has demonstrated knowledge of the State's boating and fishing communities. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) appreciates the intent of this bill and offers the following comments.

The Department recognizes the importance of members who have knowledge of boating and fishing communities on the Board. The Department feels that the current Board member selection process seeks out members with diverse knowledge of land and natural resource issues, including boating and fishing concerns, and these members are able to make qualified decisions on related issues.

Moreover, the proposed language is unclear as to what an "appropriate level of knowledge" in the State's fishing and boating communities means, and what type of organization would qualify as a "statewide fishing organization" for the purpose of making recommendations to the board.

TESTIMONY IN STRONG SUPPORT OF HB 1410 RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES

Good Morning Chair Yamane Vice Chair Todd and Members of the House Committee on Water, Land and Natural Resources:

HFACT is a not-for-profit, IRS 501c (5) organization, that advocates for small boat commercial, non-commercial, and recreational fishermen throughout Hawaii. HFACT board members sit on a number of federal fisheries management and endangered species advisory committees as well as state marine and coastal zone advisory committees; and, HFACT is thoroughly familiar with and participates in ocean and marine resource management in Hawaii and the Western and Central Pacific.

HFACT <u>STRONGLY SUPPORTS HB 1410</u> as it intends to provide a remedy to a long standing inequity which negatively affects Hawaii's fishing communities. The absence of a board member on the Board of Land and Natural Resources representing the State's fishing and boating community negatively affects them. This community has been without a representative voice on matters that critically affect Hawaii's fisheries, fishing and boating issues and even affects the State's economy. The Board of Land and Natural Resources makes decisions without the necessary, relevant and unbiased knowledge of the ocean and fishing issues before them.

HFACT appreciates that members of the Board, on occasion, reach out to individual fishermen and boaters to gather information on matters contemplated by the Board, however, fishermen fish different fisheries and utilize different gear type. The fishing activity varies widely from shoreline, nearshore, offshore, and far offshore bluewater fishing. Gear type vary from handline, rod and reel, kaka line, long line, short line, casting, net, spear, trolling, and others. Likewise boating varies tremendously by size, type and use of the boat. Substantial knowledge and experience is required to understand the nuances of impacts of matters before the Board on fishing, boating, and marine conservation. An additional member to the board will help in these deliberations and solve this inequity.

While the current board representation adequately addresses land and conservation issues, the addition of a member to the Board of Land and Natural Resources that has demonstrated knowledge of the State's fisheries, fishing and boating communities, traditional fishing rights and marine resource management and conservation will provide the Board with a sitting resource to inform and provide improved knowledge of such matters to the Board as a whole toward the making of well informed decisions. As such, HFACT urges the committee **to vote aye on HB 1410**.

HFACT thanks the chair, vice-chair, and committee members for this opportunity to provide testimony.
