Chairs Wakai and Nishihara, Vice Chairs Taniguchi and Wakai, and Members of the Senate Committees on Energy, Economic Development, and Tourism, and Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and Military Affairs.

The Office of Planning (OP) **supports** HB 1457, HD2, provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in the Administration's Executive Budget. HB 1457, HD2 appropriates general funds to OP to assist the County of Maui Planning Department in the development and implementation of the Wailuku-Kahului Transit Corridor Master Plan. The project is one of the transit-oriented development (TOD) capital improvement project (CIP) funding requests the Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development (TOD Council) has recommended for funding in Fiscal Year 2020.

This investment could be transformative for the region: the proposed project would produce a plan to guide redevelopment and transit corridor improvements needed to increase community livability and accommodate affordable housing along the transit spine between Wailuku Town and Kahului—essentially linking key State and County of Maui TOD projects identified in the TOD Council's *Strategic Plan for Transit-Oriented Development*.

OP respectfully requests restoring the funding amount of \$500,000 for Fiscal Year 2020—as requested by the County—and further, that the funds be appropriated to the County of Maui as the expending agency, as the County Planning Department is the appropriate entity to expend the funds and implement this measure. Funding through an appropriation to OP will, by its nature, delay County receipt of the funds. OP is willing to assist the Maui Planning Department with the project to the degree that our resources allow.

Dear Senator Nishihara, Senator Wakai and members of the Senate Comittee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental and Military Affairs:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in **support** of HB1457. The purpose of this bill is to appropriate funds to the Office of Planning for the planning and devlopment of the Wailuku-Kahului Transit Corridor Master Plan in the County of Maui.

A Wailuku-Kahului Transit Corridor Master Plan would enable Maui County to apply for a federal BUILD grant to finance the construction of multimodal transportation improvements. Kaʻahumanu Avenue serves over 50,000 vehicles daily, connecting Maui's primary commercial area in Kahului to its government seat in Wailuku. Imagine Kaʻahumanu Avenue transformed into a bus rapid transit corridor with safe walking and biking connections from surrounding communities and institutions to the transit stops. This is one of many alternatives the study would vet through technical analysis and public involvement.

Providing residents and visitors with multimodal options will help alleviate traffic congestion and encourage good health through walking and biking. County of Maui, Maui MPO, and community partners are working in coordination to promote walkable communities and transportation options through Hele Mai Maui 2040 Transportation Plan, Maui Bus service, Complete Streets and Community Plan updates. We are prepared to plan and implement a Wailuku-Kahului Transit Corridor.

Passage of this bill would accelerate Maui's ability to leverage a transportation corridor improvement to attract investment in housing and walkable mixed use development in Central Maui. Please support HB1457 to fund the Wailuku-Kahului Transit Corridor Master Plan.
