RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION

January 31, 2019

Chair Lee and members of the House Committee on Judiciary, thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill No. 1485. The purpose of this bill is to establish an automatic preregistration program for public school students who are least sixteen years old, but not yet eighteen years old, to preregister to vote.

The Office of Elections believes that this bill will maximize voter registration by requiring the Department of Education to provide voter registration applications to all sixteen-year-olds enrolled in a public high school. We would note that all applicants must affirm to the three statements on the application indicating that they are 1) a citizen of the United States of America; 2) at least 16 years of age; and 3) a resident of the State of Hawaii. These affirmations must be transmitted to election officials to complete an applicant's registration.

Title of Bill: HB 1485 RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

Purpose of Bill: Beginning on 1/1/2020, provides that any public high school student

who is at least sixteen years old but not yet eighteen years old, is otherwise eligible to vote, and submits a voter affidavit shall be automatically prerequistered to vote if that person is not already

preregistered to vote; provided that upon receipt of notification from the respective county clerk the applicant shall have until their eighteenth birthday to opt out of automatic voter registration. Appropriates funds.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education (Education) appreciates the intent of HB 1485 to increase Hawaii's youth voter participation and encourage civic engagement. This measure proposes to establish a process for the automatic preregistering of public school-enrolled sixteen- and seventeen-year-olds to vote in our state.

As Superintendent, I highly support automatic voter registration as a mechanism to remove barriers to registration for eligible voters as a path to voter participation. However, I have strong concerns with HB 1485 which proposes to connect voter registration with public school student data. Thus, I am unable to support HB 1485 as it adversely affects adherence to the federal law, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), which governs the access of educational information and records to public entities and protects the privacy of student education records. FERPA allows "school officials" with a legitimate educational interest to access students' education records without prior consent; registering to vote is not a legitimate educational interest, and thus, would prohibit the Department from allowing unauthorized access to student education records.

HB 1485 has potential financial implications for the Department as it will need to acquire an application or database to provide the requested information to the Office of Elections. As previously noted, access by election officials to our internal student information systems is prohibited per privacy regulations.

Further, the National Conference of State Legislatures has reported that over 90 percent of the states identify their department of motor vehicles as the agency with oversight of automatic voter registration. Notably, Massachusetts taps into their health care database. At this time, the Department is unaware of another state that has sought to target only public school children or a department of education's student information database.

Lastly, due to the age group focused in HB 1485, another important area of strong concern is parental rights and consent. One of parents' most important rights is the right to give (or not give) their consent for certain actions of the school system with respect to their child.

The Department appreciates the opportunity to provide testimony on this measure.

Chair Lee, Vice-Chair San Buenaventura and Committee Members:

The League of Women Voters strongly supports HB 1485 that would provide public high school students age 16 but not yet 18 and otherwise eligible to vote to be automatically preregistered. This is a very innovative approach to building lifelong voting habits among young people; our hope is it also starts a lifelong habit of being engaged in civic life and becoming informed voters who learn as much as possible about issues and candidates.

We concur with this bill's finding that there are hundreds of thousands of eligible people in Hawaii who have not yet registered to vote. Based on November 2018 figures it may be as high as 257,000, an estimated 25% of those eligible to vote. Combined with last November's very low turnout of 52% of registered voters, only 39% of those eligible actually voted. This situation must be reversed, if we are to make democracy work in Hawaii.

We must exert effort on both side of the voting equation, improving registration and improving turnout among registered voters. Automatic preregistration and automatic voter registration are simple fixes for the first step of this challenge.

We are pleased that Hawaii's public high schools already require a mandatory course, "Participation in Democracy," and strongly believe participation in civic education could be enhanced by pre-registering students to vote. This is the main reason the League supports this bill.

Automatic voter registration is expected to save money.¹ Based on processing during the November 2016 election cycle, one estimate is Hawaii spent \$574,228 on voter registration. While there will be startup costs incurred for switching to the more modern approach, one study suggested operating cost savings of about \$3.54 per record (\$475,270 for Hawaii) by switching from paper to an automated approach.

There are other automatic voter registration bills under consideration this session including HB1217 and HB1544 being heard today. The League supports all these measures; they could all be implemented simultaneously. We

note that HB1544 and HB1485 feature "back end declination," where elections officials send a postcard reminder to the voter that they have been registered to vote but can return a postcard in order to opt out. We would like to hear more from Hawaii registration officials about their preferred approach to informing voters who are automatically registered that they have the right to decline to register. We do support informing voters about this opt-out right during the transaction at the registration agency,

An appropriation for this bill is appropriate as the high school student population is less familiar with how to register to vote than older people. We defer to registration and elections officials on what this amount should be.

We support the effective date of January 1, 2020. Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony.

TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION

Registration to vote is a precious right, not to be taken for granted. Registration should be a conscious, affirmative decision made by an eligible person who knows what he/she is doing. Registration to vote should not be something that happens automatically, accidentally, or by default while engaged in some other activity such as: filing a tax return or application for public assistance or driver license or state ID or merely turning 16 years old.

Automatic voter registration does nothing to prevent non-citizens or even illegal aliens from voting. There are news reports that California explicitly encourages illegal aliens to get driver licenses or state ID cards, and to get public welfare assistance. Therefore automatic voter registration as a part of such activities is reported to have allowed many thousands of non-citizens and illegal aliens to vote.

Do-gooders think society should do everything possible to increase voter participation by making it easy and convenient to register and then to vote. But I think it's better to require people to go out of their way first to register, and then to vote.

If someone has such little knowledge about the candidates, or cares so little about the election that he is unwilling to make the effort to register, or to go to the polling place on election day, then perhaps we're all better off if he does not vote.

Low voter registration or turnout is evidence that people can't find issues or candidates they consider worthy of voting for. Personally, I don't mind if voter turnout is low, because that magnifies the effectiveness of my own vote. Ignorant or apathetic people are welcome to abstain.

The right to vote should be exercised by people who know how precious is the blood and treasure sacrificed to make it possible. The founders of our nation signed the Declaration of Independence right below its closing words "... we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Surely we can show our respect by sacrificing a few minutes to register before the deadline, or by spending a few minutes extra at the polling place on election day to do same-day registration.

The next step in this mad rush to increase voter turnout would be to abolish voter registration altogether. Simply adopt the system we all saw in news reports a few years ago about voting in Iraq and Afghanistan — INKY PINKY. Let anyone who wants to vote go to a polling place near home, stick the right-hand index finger into a can of indelible black paint, grab a ballot, fill it in, and drop it in the ballot box. The paint will not wear off for at least a day, thereby preventing someone from voting twice. This foolproof method also saves county clerks a lot of time and money, and saves the lives of several trees no longer needed for making the paper for the poll books.

Chair Lee and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General appreciates the intent of this bill and provides the following comments.

The purpose of H.B. No. 1485 is to establish a system for automatic voter preregistration for public high school students at least 16-years-old. The new preregistration system would automatically preregister students who are eligible to preregister to vote under chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and who properly complete affidavits provided by the Department of Education (Department).

As part of the automatic voter registration system, this bill proposes that "databases maintained or operated by the department of education for implementation of this section shall be directly accessible and provided electronically to election officials and the statewide voter registration system[.]" (Page 6, lines 10-13). Concerns about this sharing requirement stem from the fact that student information is confidential and protected by the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g. Moreover, under FERPA, parental consent is required before the Department can release information from a student's education record. While FERPA includes exceptions to the general requirement for parental consent, none of those exceptions apply here. See 34 CFR § 99.31. Requiring the Department to make its databases, which contain a wealth of student information, directly accessible to election officials and the statewide voter registration system would result in a FERPA violation.

To avoid a FERPA violation, the Department would be required to create a separate database to be used solely to collect this information for transmission only to the election officials. We recommend the following amendment to subsection (e) on page 6, lines 10 - 13, to achieve this purpose:

"[Databases] <u>A separate database</u> maintained or operated by the department of education for implementation of this section, used solely to collect voter registration information pursuant to this section, shall be directly accessible and provided electronically to <u>only state and county</u> election officials and the statewide voter registration system"

Common Cause Hawaii supports the idea of making sure that all students 16 and above are aware of their ability to pre-register to vote. We have some concerns, however, about automatically converting the pre-registration to a regular voter registration at age 18, without additional notification to the students.

When students leave high school at age 18 or before, they often move out of their previous address, to go to college, military service, or work in some other location. If they are preregistered at age 16, they are likely to forget that by the time they are 18 and fail to change their address. We recommend amending this bill to require the Office of Elections (or other specific officer) to mail a confirmation card at age 18 that would check on current address and continued desire to be registered to vote in Hawaii.

We hope that the provisions to pre-register 16 year olds to vote will increase interest in politics and participation in democratic processes. Therefore, we support HB1485, but ask that you consider the amendment suggested.
