DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) appreciates the intent of the measure; however, the department respectfully opposes this measure due to concerns of confidentiality and privacy related to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and state law prohibiting release of information.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of the bill is that any person who is eligible to vote and submits a state tax return or application for public assistance shall be automatically registered to vote if that person is not already registered to vote; provided that, upon receipt of notification from the respective county clerk, the applicant shall have 21 calendar days to opt out of automatic voter registration. Appropriates funds.

SNAP is an exclusively federally funded program through the United States

Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food and Nutrition Service (FNS). The USDA, FNS, in establishing uniform standards of operation for the SNAP program nationally, provides regulations that protect an individual's right to privacy and confidentiality. Disclosure of information obtained from an applicant may be made only to persons directly connected with the administration of SNAP or to others provided that the applicant signs a release form documenting their agreement to the specific release of information. Such an agreement

shall not be a condition of receipt of benefits as provided under 7 CFR Section 272.1(c).

Furthermore, section 346-10(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, prohibits such disclosure. Section 346-10(b) states, "[d]isclosure to any committee or legislative body (federal, state, or local) of any information that identifies by name and address any such applicant or recipient; and <u>publication of lists or names of applicants and recipients shall be prohibited</u>."

However, through a collaborative effort with the State Elections Office, applicants for public assistance are provided the option to register to vote. Applications for public assistance have an attached voter registration form that they can complete and return to their county clerk's office if they choose to register.

DHS respectfully suggests that "an application of public benefits" and all mention of the director of the department of human services be deleted from the bill draft.

Chair Lee and members of the House Committee on Judiciary, thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill No. 1544. The purpose of this bill is to establish an automatic voter registration program for those submitting state tax returns or applications for public assistance.

The Office of Elections believes that this bill will increase opportunities for members of our community to register to vote. We would note that all applicants registering to vote confirm by self-subscribing affidavit, that they meet the qualifications: 1) a citizen of the United States of America; 2) at least 16 years of age; and 3) a resident of the State of Hawaii. There is no mechanism for election officials to confirm that an applicant is a citizen of the United States as stated in Section 2 of this bill.

Re: H.B. 1544, Relating to Voter Registration

The Department of Taxation (Department) appreciates the intent of H.B. 1544, but has serious concerns about its ability to administer its provisions and offers the following comments for the Committee's consideration.

H.B. 1544 establishes an automatic voter registration system and authorizes the Department to collect voter registration information on state tax return forms. A summary of key provisions are as follows:

- Adds a new section to Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) Chapter 11 stating that beginning January 1, 2020, any person who is eligible to vote and completes a state tax return or application for public assistance shall be automatically registered to vote;
- Requires the Director of Taxation and the Director of Human Services to use designated forms for voter registration;
- Requires the Director of Taxation and the Director of Human Services to electronically transmit voter registration information to the clerk of the county in which the applicant resides, to election officials, and to the statewide voter registration system within five calendar days of collection of a completed voter registration affidavit; unless the applicant affirmatively declines to be registered to vote;
- Requires the clerk of each county to determine whether an applicant is eligible to register to vote and to provide written notification to the applicant of the process to opt out of the automatic voter registration, which the applicant has twenty-one calendar days to do;
- Gives election officials and the statewide voter registration system direct access upon request to databases maintained or operated by the Department of Taxation and the Department of Human Services, provided that the Chief Election Officer establish and implement an information privacy policy to prohibit disclosure of financial information, social security and driver's license numbers, citizenship status, and other confidential, sensitive, or extraneous information not related to voter registration;

- Adds a new section to chapter 231, HRS, stating that the form used for voter registration shall be a state tax return form;
- Amends section 11-15, HRS, to assign transaction numbers to new automatic voter registrations;
- Amends section 231-18, HRS, to authorize the Department to furnish voter registration information collected under the new section in chapter 11, HRS;
- Amends section 346-10, HRS, to authorize disclosure by the Department of Human Services of voter registration information collected under the new section in chapter 11, HRS;
- Amends section 346-29, HRS, to require applications for public assistance to include the information required for automatic voter registration;
- Makes unspecified appropriations out of the general fund for fiscal year 2019-2020 and fiscal year 2020-20201 for the electronic transmission, receipt, and processing of voter registration information; and
- Effective January 1, 2020, with the unspecified appropriations taking effect on July 1, 2019.

The Department has serious concerns regarding allowing access to Department databases which contain confidential taxpayer information by anyone who is not an authorized Department employee for non-tax purposes. While the Department appreciates the effort to outline a robust information privacy policy and take steps to prevent disclosure of sensitive data, granting database access to election officials would represent a serious erosion of taxpayer confidentiality.

It is important to remember that our State's tax system is based on voluntary compliance with the tax laws. A system based on voluntary compliance requires taxpayers to candidly report their income and to proactively pay the tax they owe. The primary incentive to encourage taxpayers to candidly report tax information is the guarantee of confidentiality of the information they report. Allowing access to confidential tax information in this manner could negatively impact the public's confidence in the confidentiality of its tax information, thereby reducing voluntary compliance and impeding the Department's ability to effectively enforce and collect the State's taxes.

Furthermore, confidential tax information should only be disclosed on a need-to-know basis. The State laws in this area are very strict and the Department takes confidentiality of tax information very seriously. Department personnel and other state personnel authorized to receive confidential tax information are subject to strict criminal penalties for unauthorized disclosure, including the possibility of felony conviction and imprisonment.

Department personnel are also subject to federal restrictions and penalties due to the presence of Federal Tax Information (FTI) in the Department's database. The Department relies on FTI received from the IRS to target and perform audits. Maintaining access to FTI is critical to the administration of taxes, and unauthorized disclosure of FTI is a federal crime.

Finally, in terms of logistics, the requirement for the Director to electronically transmit voter registration information within five calendar days of collection is not feasible. Queues and processing times after the receipt of tax forms routinely exceed five calendar days, especially during the busiest parts of tax season. This is especially true for tax returns submitted in paper

form. Because of the challenges that this automatic voter registration system would pose to Department operations and confidentiality, the Department respectfully requests that the provisions relating to the Department and State tax returns be removed from this measure.

Chair Lee, Vice-Chair San Buenaventura and Committee Members:

The League of Women Voters strongly supports HB1544 that requires any person who is eligible to vote and submits a state tax return or application for public assistance shall be automatically registered to vote if that person is not already registered to vote.

We concur with this bill's finding that there are hundreds of thousands of eligible people in Hawaii who have not yet registered to vote. Based on November 2018 figures it may be as high as 257,000, an estimated 25% of those eligible to vote. Combined with last November's very low turnout of 52% of registered voters, only 39% of those eligible voted. This situation must be reversed, if we are to make democracy work in Hawaii.

We must exert effort on both side of the voting equation, improving registration and improving turnout among registered voters. Automatic preregistration and automatic voter registration are simple fixes for the first step of this challenge.

Automatic voter registration is expected to save money.¹ Based on processing during the November 2016 election cycle, one estimate is Hawaii spent \$574,228 on voter registration. While there will be startup costs incurred for switching to the more modern approach, one study suggested operating cost savings of about \$3.54 per record (\$475,270 for Hawaii) by switching from paper to an automated approach.

There are other automatic voter registration bills under consideration this session including HB1217 and HB1544 being heard today. The League supports both these measures; they could all be implemented simultaneously. We note that this bill features a "back end declination," where "upon receipt of notification from the respective county clerk, the applicant shall have 21 calendar days to opt out of automatic voter registration. Elections officials would send a postcard reminder to the voter that they have been registered to vote but can return a postcard in order to opt out. We would like to hear more from Hawaii registration officials about their preferred approach to informing voters who are automatically registered that they have the right to decline to

register. We do support informing voters about their right to opt-out right during the transaction at the registration agency (in this case the Department of Taxation or the Department of Human Services).

Because some start-up data exchange systems would need to be built between County Clerks, the Department of Registration and the Department of Human Services, an appropriation is required, and we defer to these officials about the likely cost. We support the effective date of January 1, 2020. Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony.

Dear Chair Lee, Vice Chair San Buenaventura, and members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in **SUPPORT** of **HB 1544**, which would automatically register eligible citizens to vote when eligible voters submit a tax return or apply for public assistance, unless they choose to opt out.

According to the United States Election Project, fewer than 4 in 10 of Hawai'i's voting-eligible population voted in the 2018 general election, yet again placing us last in the nation.¹

The logistical barriers to registering to vote for our low-income neighbors, since they are likely to have the time or flexibility in their schedules to register in person or via mail, and are less likely to have internet access to register online.

Automatic Voter Registration (AVR) would help overcome those barriers for low-income residents of our state, especially the automatic registration of voters when they apply for public assistance.

In addition, an AVR system would ensure that the registration process is convenient, accurate, and secure. We need to act get more than 4 in 10 of our eligible voters to vote in our elections. AVR would be a good start.

TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION

Registration to vote is a precious right, not to be taken for granted. Registration should be a conscious, affirmative decision made by an eligible person who knows what he/she is doing. Registration to vote should not be something that happens automatically, accidentally, or by default while engaged in some other activity such as: filing a tax return or application for public assistance or driver license or state ID or merely turning 16 years old.

Automatic voter registration does nothing to prevent non-citizens or even illegal aliens from voting. There are news reports that California explicitly encourages illegal aliens to get driver licenses or state ID cards, and to get public welfare assistance. Therefore automatic voter registration as a part of such activities is reported to have allowed many thousands of non-citizens and illegal aliens to vote.

Do-gooders think society should do everything possible to increase voter participation by making it easy and convenient to register and then to vote.

But I think it's better to require people to go out of their way first to register, and then to vote.

If someone has such little knowledge about the candidates, or cares so little about the election that he is unwilling to make the effort to register, or to go to the polling place on election day, then perhaps we're all better off if he does not vote.

Low voter registration or turnout is evidence that people can't find issues or candidates they consider worthy of voting for. Personally, I don't mind if voter turnout is low, because that magnifies the effectiveness of my own vote. Ignorant or apathetic people are welcome to abstain.

The right to vote should be exercised by people who know how precious is the blood and treasure sacrificed to make it possible. The founders of our nation signed the Declaration of Independence right below its closing words "... we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Surely we can show our respect by sacrificing a few minutes to register before the deadline, or by spending a few minutes extra at the polling place on election day to do same-day registration.

The next step in this mad rush to increase voter turnout would be to abolish voter registration altogether. Simply adopt the system we all saw in news reports a few years ago about voting in Iraq and Afghanistan — INKY PINKY. Let anyone who wants to vote go to a polling place near home, stick the right-hand index finger into a can of indelible black paint, grab a ballot, fill it in, and drop it in the ballot box. The paint will not wear off for at least a day, thereby preventing someone from voting twice. This foolproof method also saves county clerks a lot of time and money, and saves the lives of several trees no longer needed for making the paper for the poll books.

Chair Lee and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General appreciates the intent of this bill and provides the following comments.

The purpose of H.B. No. 1544 is to establish a system for automatic voter registration in the State. The new registration system would automatically register any person who is eligible to vote under chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and who properly completes and submits either a state tax return or an application for public assistance. (Page 3, lines 2-3).

As part of the automatic voter registration system, this bill proposes that "databases maintained or operated by the department of taxation and the department of human services shall be directly accessible and provided electronically to election officials and the statewide voter registration system[.]" (Page 5, lines 19-21; page 6, line 1). Since the use and disclosure of tax information may subject individuals, including election officials, to civil and criminal penalties for unauthorized disclosure of federal returns and return information pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 6103(a)(3), providing access to the Department of Taxation's databases creates significant concerns.

To prevent the possibility of unauthorized disclosure of federal returns and return information to election officials, we suggest the language of this bill be amended such that election officials are not allowed access to the Department of Taxation's databases.

We are also concerned that the bill fails to provide sufficient notification to tax filers and those on public assistance that their information will automatically be shared with another information data system. Further, individuals filing taxes and, even more so, applying for public assistance expect these processes to be confidential and so have a reasonable expectation of privacy. Automatic sharing of what are expected to be confidential processes, despite protections imposed upon the agencies and the option to opt out, runs contrary to that expectation.

Finally, we note the potential problem with what we consider disparate treatment of individuals on public assistance, who would be subject to this automatic sharing of their personal information while individuals who do not need public assistance would not have their information shared in this manner.

We acknowledge the goal of increasing voter registration but have concerns that the means used to achieve this goal may be overreaching. We offer our assistance to the Committee to amend the bill so that it addresses both our concerns and the bill's commendable goal.

Common Cause Hawaii has long supported automatic voter registration as a way to encourage more interest and participation in democratic processes.

However, we believe it is important that applicants for public assistance and taxpayers be able to opt-out **at the time** they file. Our concern is that, in effect, this bill appears to force preliminary registration by transmitting certain personal information without permission and leaves opt-out to a later time. Notification of this option later, with a 21 day period to respond, is not sufficient, since some may have moved, have no permanent address, or be out of the state for more than the 21 day opt-out period, and therefore not receive the information.

We urge you to **amend this bill** to make clear to an applicant or taxpayer that their information will be transmitted for voter registration purposes unless they opt out at that point.
