HOUSE BILL NO. 1654 HD2 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chairperson Luke and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill 1654 HD2, relating to feral swine control. The bill proposes to appropriate funds to the Department of Agriculture for fiscal year 2020-2021 for feral pig control, including: grants for fencing; grants for corral traps; and a program to reduce feral pig populations.

The department supports the bill's intent to provide funds for feral swine control and provides the following comments: Article VII, section 4, of the State Constitution provides that no grant of public money or property shall be made except pursuant to standards provided by law. Therefore, because this bill does not include any standards by which these grants shall be made, the DOA will not be able to expend the funds appropriated should this measure be enacted. We suggest deleting the word "grants for" in lines 5 and 6 of the bill, in order to allow the DOA to expend the funds for fencing and corral traps (just not in the form of grants).

Fencing and trapping are useful means to reduce the effects of feral swine on farms. The most effective use of these control measures is when they are integrated into a



focused control program. Design of a control program to reduce feral swine populations is best directed by other agencies such as DLNR and USDA APHIS Wildlife Services that have extensive experience with design and managing feral swine control programs. The Department notes that a similar measure, SB2719 SD1, funds to the Department of Agriculture to work in collaboration with the Department of Land and Natural Resources to increase feral pig control.

I am Brian Miyamoto, Executive Director of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,800 farm family members statewide and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawaii Farm Bureau supports HB 1654, HD2, which appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture for feral pig control.

Feral pigs can cause major damage to property, agriculture (crops and livestock), Hawaii's native species and ecosystems, and Hawaii's cultural and historic resources. Feral pigs can also threaten the health of people, wildlife, pets, and other domestic animals. As Hawaii's feral pig populations continue to expand, these damages, costs, and risks will only keep rising.

Feral pigs cause tremendous damage to agriculture, including crops, nursery, livestock, and pasture. They damage crops by consuming them or by their rooting and trampling of crops. They will eat almost any crop. Feral pigs damage pasture grasses, killing desired plant species and often encouraging the growth of undesired weed species. They can also devastate orchards by consuming fruit, citrus, and nuts and their rooting can severely damage, or even kill saplings, shrubs, and vines directly or by facilitating the spread of soil-based fungal diseases. Feral pigs can also break irrigation lines, rip or tear nets, drying racks, and other agricultural structures and equipment.

Hawaii's farmers and ranchers appreciate any effort to help control the feral pig population and the negative impacts that feral pigs have on Hawaii's agriculture industry.
