#### Re: H.B. No. 1667

The Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission (HCRC) has enforcement jurisdiction over Hawai'i's laws prohibiting discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations, and access to state and state funded services (on the basis of disability). The HCRC carries out the Hawai'i constitutional mandate that no person shall be discriminated against in the exercise of their civil rights. Art. I, Sec. 5.

#### The HCRC supports H.B. No. 1667.

H.B. No.1667, if enacted, will designate the month of October as "Disability Awareness Month: Employment, Enrichment, and Inclusion," in the State of Hawai'i. Observance of this newly designated month recognizing the employment challenges faced by persons with disabilities and highlighting their successes and contributions will raise awareness and foster greater opportunities. ## Re: H.B. No. 1667 RELATING TO HEALTH

#### I. OVERVIEW OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

HB1667 proposes to amend Chapter 8 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes by adding a new section, designating October to be "Disability Awareness Month: Employment, Enrichment, and Inclusion."

DLIR <u>supports</u> this measure as it recognizes the contributions and achievements that those with disabilities make to our community.

### III. COMMENTS ON THE HOUSE BILL

DLIR works with its partners on programs and projects such as the Disabled Employment Initiative (DEI), the Summer Youth Program, and the Waipahu High School Ohana Academy Initiative. These programs and projects help youth and adults with disabilities experience training and potential employment opportunities in the workforce.

The DEI has expanded the capacity of American Job Centers (AJCs), formerly known as the One-Stop Centers, to promote the use of existing career pathways to

serve youth and adults with disabilities, including individuals with significant disabilities, and expand existing career pathways systems to be fully inclusive and accessible to individuals with disabilities.

The Summer Youth Program provides youths with disabilities job experience at State departments, including DLIR, and has led to state employment for some former participants. Similarly, the Ohana Academy connects youths with disabilities to participating employers where they experience on-the-job training for various professions.

DLIR applauds opportunities such as the designation of Disability Awareness Month to expand the awareness of the employment contributions and achievements of those with disabilities.
