Honorable members of the agricultural and judicial committees,

My name is Heather Carpenter and I am the Western Regional Director for The Humane Society of the United States. I am writing to express support for HB 200, which creates reasonable standards for chaining dogs who live outdoors. I appreciate the opportunity to submit this written testimony on behalf of our Hawaii members and supporters, and I'm grateful to the House of Representatives for recognizing tethering as a critical issue. While our hope is that every dog would share a home with his or her human family, we understand that is not always the case, so it is important that dogs who live outdoors be protected.

Constant, improper chaining puts a dog's health and safety at risk. In many cases, the necks of chained dogs become rubbed raw and covered with sores, the result of cruelly heavy chains, poorly fitted collars and the dogs' yanking and straining to escape confinement. Additionally, it is shockingly common for law enforcement to find dogs with embedded collars, a horrible situation where the collar grows into the skin, typically requiring surgery.

The vagueness of current law makes it difficult for enforcement officers who want to take action before a dog has suffered injury or death. Often, it is too late for the dog and the owner faces criminal charges. HB 200 will create clear guidelines for both owner and officer. The intention is not simply to punish violators, but to create reasonable expectations for the humane treatment of dogs, and allow owners the ability to take proactive steps to comply.

HB 200 offers the following common sense protections for Hawaii's dogs: a) ensures that dogs who are kept outdoors be provided proper and humane restraints, with collars that won't cause pain and tethers that are not egregiously heavy and b) ensures chained dogs are provided adequate food and water. HB 200 is an important step in protecting the people and dogs of Hawaii and we look forward to its passage. Thank you very much for your time.

The Humane Society of the United States requests that HB 200 be reported favorably.

### **RE: STRONG SUPPORT for HB1281, Relating to Animal Cruelty**

We ask for your support for HB1281, which would prohibit the sale of certain animal products if the animals were raised in extreme confinement operations and also explicitly prohibit the consumption of dogs and cats. A current loophole in our animal cruelty law, that may allow for the killing of dogs or cats, if bred for consumption, must be closed to protect our family pets.

- More than 60 percent of Hawaii households own dogs or cats who are considered "pets" and members of the family. The overwhelming majority of Hawaii residents abhor the practice of dog or cat slaughter for human consumption.
- Unlike farm animals who are bred and raised for consumption, dogs and cats who are slaughtered and subsequently sold for consumption are often lost or stolen pets or acquired from the internet or free to good home advertisements.
- Unlike farm animals, neither the United States Department of Agriculture nor the Hawaii
  Department of Agriculture recognizes nor regulates the slaughter or sale of dogs and cats.
  There is no provision in our state or federal constitution that protects any rights relating
  to the slaughter or consumption of dogs or cats as a recognized cultural practice or as a
  protected individual right.
- Despite our strong anti-cruelty laws, dog slaughter for human consumption continues to occur across Hawaii as current law requires that the perpetrator be caught in the act of killing the dog or cat. Furthermore, there is no law that expressly prohibits the selling, breeding, raising, transporting, trafficking or consumption of dog or cat meat.
- The proposed law, and its "possession with intent" language, would provide local law enforcement and local humane societies the tools necessary to investigate reports of dog slaughter or trafficking. In 2015 there were 2 incidents of dogs being decapitated with their feet removed, a method used to prepare a dog for consumption. Suspects have yet to be identified in either case.

- The Philippines (1998), Taiwan (2001) and Hong Kong (1950) have long prohibited the trade in dog meat, and the Governments of Thailand and Vietnam to prohibit the transfer or transport of dogs for thecommercial dog meat trade. In the U.S., New York, New Jersey, California and other states explicitly prohibit the sale or consumption of dog (or cat) meat.
- Slaughtering dogs and cats also poses public health risks to people. While rabies is the most common vector (not present in Hawaii), toxoplasmosis, e-coli and other infectious bacterial and zoonotic diseases can be transferred to humans when slaughtering dogs or cats.

In closing, pets provide us with so much; comfort, security, safety, assisting us with disabilities, improving our health and longevity and more. Animals deserve our protection and we urge your support for H.B.1281.

Aloha Chair Creagan, Vice Chair DeCoite and Committee Members,

The Hawaiian Humane Society supports the passage of House Bill 200, which would prohibit the use of specific tethering equipment and techniques that are injurious to dogs.

This bill does not prohibit dog tethering. It gives our humane investigators a tool to educate dog owners about proper tethering equipment that is readily available and appropriate techniques that are easy to implement. Making simple changes should allow dog owners to comply with these rules and keep their pets safe.

We request two amendments to the measure, which are reflected in the attached HD1 proposed:

- Please remove section 1 (1) (g) (iii) regarding tether length. The 10-foot rule is arbitrary and the provision that immediately follows, 1 (1) (g) (iv) accomplishes the goal of making sure the tether is of sufficient length for the size of the dog.
- Also we request the removal of the changes in Section 1 (1) (h) and subsection (4). The
  penalties in the existing animal cruelty statute already give the court broad discretion in
  sentencing.

On behalf of the Hawaiian Humane Society, I urge you to pass HB 200 HD1 proposed to enhance protections for our canine companions.

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 711-1109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended as follows:

- 1. By amending subsection (1) to read:
- "(1) A person commits the offense of cruelty to animals in the second degree if the person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:
- (a) Overdrives, overloads, tortures, torments, beats, causes substantial bodily injury to, or starves any animal, or causes the overdriving, overloading, torture, torment, beating, or starving of any animal;
- (b) Deprives a pet animal of necessary sustenance or causes [such] that deprivation;

- (c) Mutilates, poisons, or kills without need any animal other than insects, vermin, or other pests; provided that the handling or extermination of any insect, vermin, or other pest is conducted in accordance with standard and acceptable pest control practices and all applicable laws and regulations;
- (d) Keeps, uses, or in any way is connected with or interested in the management of, or receives money for the admission of any person to, any place kept or used for the purpose of fighting or baiting any bull, bear, cock, or other animal, and includes every person who encourages, aids, or assists therein, or who permits or suffers any place to be so kept or used;
- (e) Carries or causes to be carried, in or upon any vehicle or other conveyance, any animal in a cruel or inhumane manner;
- (f) Confines or causes to be confined, in a kennel or cage, any pet animal in a cruel or inhumane manner;
- (g) Tethers, fastens, ties, or restrains a dog to a doghouse, tree, fence, or any other stationary object [by], or uses a trolley, pulley, cable, or running line designed to attach a dog to two stationary objects:

(i) If the dog is under the age of six months unless the dog is engaged in a supervised activity;

### (ii) In a configuration that:

- (A) Entangles or endangers the dog; or
- (B) Prevents the dog from obtaining necessary sustenance;
- (iii) If the tether is shorter than ten feet in length, unless the dog is engaged in a supervised activity;
- (iv) If the restraint is a tow or log chain or is disproportionate to the size or weight of the dog such that the restraint inhibits the free movement of the dog within the area allowed by the tether; or
- (v) By means of a choke collar, pinch collar, or prong collar; provided that a person is not prohibited from using [such restraints] a choke collar, pinch collar, or prong collar when walking a dog with a hand-held leash or while a dog is engaged in a supervised activity; or
- (h) Assists another in the commission of any act specified in subsections (1)(a) through (1)(g): provided that a person who is convicted of assisting another in the commission of an

<u>act specified in subsection (1)(g) shall be sentenced pursuant</u>

<u>to subsection (4)(b). As used in this subsection, "assist"</u>

<u>means to instigate, engage in, or further the commission of an</u>

<u>act prohibited under this section."</u>

- 2. By amending subsection (4) to read:
- "(4) Cruelty to animals in the second degree is a misdemeanor, except [where] that if the offense [involves]:
- (a) Involves ten or more pet animals in any one instance
  [which], then cruelty to animals in the second degree is a class
  C felony[.]; or
- (b) Involves nine or fewer pet animals in any one instance and involves an act prohibited under subsection (1)(g), then the defendant shall be sentenced as follows, in addition to any other penalties the court may impose:
- (A) Payment of a fine of not more than \$500 for each abused animal;
- (B) If deemed appropriate by the court, completion of educational classes in animal abuse prevention;

| (B) <u>Completion of sixteen hours of community</u>            |
| service; and   |
| (C) <u>Imprisonment of no less than two days.</u>              |
| Notwithstanding section 706-643(2), all fines                  |
| collected under this paragraph shall be paid to the director o |
| finance of the county in which the underlying offense occurred |
| as a general fund realization of that county."                 |

SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.

SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.

The AVMA's American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) Animal Welfare Division has statedes:

"The AVMA (American Veterinary Medical Association) has not adopted specific policy on tethering as proposals to date have been based primarily on various groups and individuals' perspectives rather than on actual data, and because the conditions under which dogs may be tethered are so highly variable. The impacts of tethering on dogs have not been well quantified and appear to be substantially impacted by breed, environmental conditions (e.g., substrate, climate, and what is available to the dog to occupy its time), opportunities for contact with conspecifics and people, and the duration of time the dog is confined."



Dear Officers of the House Agriculture Committee of the State of Hawai'i - aloha!

I write, in reference to the debates in the Legislature this coming Friday, on behalf of *The Animal Interfaith Alliance*, an international alliance of faith groups founded in Britain concerned about the welfare of animals. Our member organisations and individual members include Buddhists, Christians, Hindus, Jains, Jews, Muslims and Sikhs. We are all united by our common concern for animals, based on our various faiths. Our member organisations are listed below.

May we please submit the following:

"Testimony in support of **HB681**"

We would like to support HB681. Allowing companion dogs in restaurants, at the restaurant owners' discretion, will create a more compassionate society in that it will normalise the affectionate links we have with our animal companions.

"Testimony in support of HB200"

We would like to support HB200 which would prohibit the use of certain restraints and tethers that endanger, or deny sustenance, to a dog. To be restrained in often inadequate conditions and sometimes for all their lives, is cruel and disrespectful.

"Testimony in support of HB930"

We would like to support HB930 which would prohibit pet store operators from selling a dog, cat or rabbit unless the animals were obtained from certain humane sources such as a shelter or rescue and, importantly to keep records showing the sources of the animals for sale. There can be much neglect and even cruelty in this trade and it fosters breeding when the rescues are full of animals needing good homes.

"Testimony in support of **HB24**"

We would like to support HB24 which establishes the criminal offence of sexual assault of an animal. We understand that the state's existing animal cruelty laws could be used to prosecute cases where there is evidence of physical harm to the animal, but these are not sufficient, and, in any case, to allow sexual assault goes against all norms of civilised society, which we believe Hawai'i to be.

"Testimony in support of **HB716**"

We would like to support HB716 which would prohibit the importation of wild animals for exhibition in a circus, carnival, or other live animal act or performance. We were delighted to be informed that this bill would codify last year's hard-won rule change at the state Department of Agriculture on the same subject.

"Testimony in opposition to HB127"

We would like to oppose HB127 which would create a littering penalty that would apply to anyone caring for an animal who leaves faecal waste on public or private property.

Of course, we support the requiring of guardians to clean up after their animals, but this measure could be used to punish the volunteers who care for Free-Roaming cats. This would be wholly unacceptable, as it would make it impossible to care for these needy cats, which is a duty on all societies.
