H.B. 2065, H.D. 1 – RELATING TO PUBLIC SERVICE OFFICE HOURS

The Hawaii Government Employees Association, AFSCME Local 152, AFL-CIO would like to provide comments on H.B. 2065, H.D. 1 which establishes the Public Service Office Hours Task Force to develop a plan to reduce the number of public employees that commute during hours of peak traffic congestion.

It's widely accepted that traffic in Hawai'i, particularly on Oahu, is at its all-time worst, where according to some studies, drivers waste a yearly average of 92 hours in gridlock. Therefore, we certainly understand the want to create a Public Service Office Hours Task Force to develop a plan to reduce number of public employees that commute during peak hours. With the agreement of the employer and the employees affected, it is possible to alter hours of operation for certain public services. We are pleased to report that we have already executed a variety of memorandums of agreements with our members to create alternative work week schedules, including flexible scheduling and 4/10 work weeks. However, it is important to note that changes to employees' schedules must be negotiated and mutually beneficial to both the employee's and the employer's needs.
