Chair Yamane, Vice Chair Todd and Members of the House Committee on Water, Land, and Hawaiian Affairs.

The Office of Planning (OP) supports this measure which requires that the Office of Planning conduct a land use study for Hauula, Oahu in order to assess mid-term solutions and long-term options and respectfully offers the following **comments**.

Should the measure pass, the OP Coastal Zone Management (OP-CZM) Program would support the activities in this measure and can serve as a convening and facilitating entity to identify key stakeholders across jurisdictions that have an interest in the area and would be impacted by any mid-term and long-term activities to maintain the transit corridor.

However, a land use study would be in addition to OP-CZM staff's already full-time obligations. Thus, the OP requests an appropriation in the amount of \$250,000 in order to conduct a land use study to meet the specifications as described in this measure, provided that it does not adversely affect the executive budget.
