In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2253 RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE

House Bill 2253 proposes to amend the statewide traffic code to allow for the Chairperson of Board of Land and Natural Resources and county chiefs of police to designate state or county employees or contractors to issue citations for traffic violations. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this measure.**

The number of visitors who visit State parks, trails, and scenic areas has increased steadily, resulting in visitors parking illegally on State highways in remote areas. This impacts not only those areas, but also adjacent communities, private lands, and road corridors servicing these attractions. Unlike the State Airport and Harbor Divisions of the Department of Transportation, the Highway Division does not have an enforcement branch.

The Department's Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement (DOCARE), along with City and County police departments provide needed enforcement in special no stopping, standing, or parking zones along state highways adjacent to our State Park areas such as at Hā'ena and Waimea Canyon State Parks on Kaua'i, and the parks and waysides along the Hāna Highway on Maui.

Due to the shortage of law enforcement officers throughout the State, the State and City and Counties would like the flexibility of assigning other state and city and county employees, as well as contracted parking vendors to cite illegally parked cars in designated special no stopping, standing, or parking zones along State Highways.

This bill provides the Department with an additional management tool and will ultimately improve safety for all highway users and pedestrians and minimize negative impacts of illegally parked cars to surrounding neighborhoods and off-limits areas. It will also have the ancillary benefit of freeing up law enforcement officers for criminal and resource violations deemed more critical than simple parking infractions.

TESTIMONY TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

House Bill 2253 - Relating to the Traffic Code

The Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB) **SUPPORTS** House Bill 2253. This bill would authorize the chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources to designate state employees or contractors, or the county police chiefs to designate county employees or contractors, as empowered to cite vehicles for certain traffic code violations, including illegally parked vehicles.

While DCAB administers the statewide parking program for disabled persons, county police departments, the Department of Accounting and General Services, and the Department of Transportation are authorized to enforce the parking violations provisions found in Hawaii Revised Statutes, Chapter 291, Part III Parking for Disabled Persons. However, one of the more common complaints DCAB receives is from people who observe a vehicle parked in a reserved accessible space without a disability parking permit, contact an enforcement agency, and discover that the agency is unable to respond in a timely manner. Thus, increasing the number of agencies and persons who are authorized to issue citations will help to alleviate this situation.

The County of Kauai **strongly supports** HB 2253 which amends the statewide traffic code to allow for the chairperson of the BLNR and county chiefs of police to designate state or county employees or contractors to issue citations for traffic violations.

Our state and county parks and beaches are overwhelmed with residents and visitors alike. Honorable Chair Aquino, Vice Chair Hashimoto, and Members of the Committee:

Good morning, I am County of Kauai Police Chief Todd Raybuck. On behalf of the Kauai Police Department, I would like to thank you for considering my written testimony in regards to amending the statewide traffic code to allow county chiefs of police and for the chairperson of the BLNR to designate state or county employees or contractors to issue citations for traffic violations.

I am writing to register testimony in **strong support** of HB 2253. This amendment would improve public safety, improve the efficiency of first responders being able to respond to priority calls, and provide better community relations by potentially having a dedicated parking enforcement presence that could educate the public and issue citations when necessary. Due to the shortage of police officers throughout the State, the State and City and Counties would like the flexibility of assigning other state, city and county employees to cite illegally parked cars in designated special no stopping, standing, or parking zones along State Highways.

Kauai in particular has seen a drastic increase in parking violators, particularly on the north shore areas of Haena Beach Park, Lumahai, Tunnels, and Cold Pond. As of January 25th 2020, 211 parking citations were issued by KPD officers for illegal parking in the locations mentioned. This does not take into account the number of citations issued by State law enforcement, or warnings issued. The rise in parking violators is due to increased tourism combined with limited parking in the area. Unlike the State Airport and Harbor Divisions, the Highway division does not have an enforcement branch. City and County police departments provide needed enforcement in special no stopping, standing, or parking zones along State highways. This bill will ultimately



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improve safety for all highway users and pedestrians and minimize negative impacts of illegally parked vehicles.

Thank you for your consideration of this bill amendment.

Dear Chair Aquino and Vice Chair Hashimoto and members of the House Transportation Committee,

I am STONGLY in support of HB 2253 (Meter maid Bill) as it will provide new tools to help our community deal with the excessive number of cars whose drivers completely disregard the no parking zones set up to ensure the safety of the public and help manage visitor numbers in our community. I am testifying today as the President of the National Tropical Botanical Garden which operates four botanical gardens in Hawaii including two that are heavily impacted by illegally parked cars. Dear Chair Aquino and Vice Chair Hashimoto and members of the House Transportation Committee,

I strongly support HB 2253. Over time, the number of tourists who visit Hawaii State Parks, trails, and scenic areas has significantly increased. Their traffic has contributed to visitors parking illegally on State highways in remote areas, resulting in safety concerns for emergency vehicles and others who transverse along our roads. As a Kauai resident, I have seen this most clearly on our North Shore at Haena State Park. However, I know that illegally parked vehicles pose a safety concern in other areas of our island and throughout the State of Hawaii.

HDOT State Highway's does not have an enforcement branch and relies on City and County police departments provide needed enforcement in special no stopping, standing, or parking zones along State highways.
