Chair Nishihara and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General (Department) supports this bill with proposed amendments.

The purpose of this bill is to protect the health and safety of the public by regulating the sale and use of electric guns. This bill is substantially the same as Senate Bill No. 2437, passed by this Committee on February 7, 2020, except that this bill modifies the training requirement for licensee and their employees who sell electric guns by only requiring them to receive the training once, rather than every three years. This bill also includes, in section 8, an amendment to section 463-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to reference the new definition of electric gun.

The constitutionality of Hawaii's electric gun ban has been drawn into question by the United States Supreme Court decision in <u>Caetano v. Massachusetts</u>, 136 S. Ct. 1027 (2016). And a pending lawsuit in the United States District Court for the District of Hawaii, <u>Roberts v. Ballard</u>, 18-00125 HG-KSC, is seeking a declaratory judgment and injunction to invalidate Hawaii's electric gun ban. If Hawaii's electric gun ban is invalidated by the courts, there will be no regulations on the purchase, possession, and use of electric guns by the public.

This bill repeals Hawaii's ban on electric guns, creates a regulatory scheme for electric guns, and limits the use of electric guns to self defense. The bill requires

electric guns that use projectiles, such as Tasers, to be subject to a permitting and registration process similar to firearms. It requires sellers of electric guns to be licensees and keep records of inventory and sales. This bill also creates criminal offenses for the use or possession of electric guns in the commission of a misdemeanor or felony.

It is the Department's understanding that the county police chiefs support the regulatory scheme that would require electric guns that use projectiles be subject to a permitting and registration process similar to firearms.

The Department requests that the bill be amended to clarify the wording authorizing a fingerprint background check in section 2 by modifying the wording on page 7, lines 10-16:

The issuing authority shall perform an inquiry on an applicant by using the International Justice and Public Safety Network, including the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement query, and the National Crime Information Center, pursuant to section 846-2.7, before any determination to issue a permit or to deny an application is made.

It should be amended to read:

The issuing authority shall perform a fingerprint-based background check pursuant to section 846-2.7, before any determination to issue a permit or to deny an application is made.

Section 846-2.7(b), HRS, should be amended by adding a new paragraph that reads as follows:

(50) The county police departments on applicants for permits to acquire electric guns pursuant to section 134-C and on individuals registering their electric guns pursuant to section 134-D.

We respectfully ask this Committee pass this bill with the recommended amendments.






