RELATING TO ENERGY RESOURCES.

Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen and Members of the Committee, the Hawaii State Energy Office (HSEO) respectfully opposes and offers comments on HB 2498, HD1, which proposes to repeal authorization for agencies that perform energy efficiency retrofitting to receive budget appropriations for energy expenditures at an amount that does not fall below the pre-retrofitting energy budget and to have the agencies set aside a portion of the moneys saved through efficiency and renewable energy system retrofitting to pay for costs directly associated with administering energy efficiency and renewable energy system retrofitting purposes.

As outlined in HRS 196-71 b(2), the HSEO is established with a defined focus, to "Lead efforts to incorporate energy efficiency, energy resiliency, renewable energy, energy resiliency, and clean transportation to reduce costs and achieve clean energy goals across all public facilities..." (https://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/hrscurrent/Vol03 Ch0121-0200D/HRS0196/HRS_0196-0071.htm). The \$507.1 million in energy performance contracts put in place since 1996, will save the state an estimated \$1.2 billion in electricity savings over the life of the contracts. This includes 295 buildings and facilities covering over 112 million square feet (https://energy.hawaii.gov/wp-content/uploads/2020/01/HSEO-Annual-Report-2019.pdf). This proposed measure will significantly impact agencies participation in energy performance contracting and energy retrofits.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education (Department) respectfully offers comments regarding HB 2498, HD1.

Over the past three years, the Department invested \$46.4 million in energy efficiency measures through the Hawaii Green Infrastructure Authority Green Energy Money and \$aver (HGIA GEM\$) Loan program resulting in over 12 million kilowatt hours of energy savings, which is approximately 9% of the energy consumption. These loans must be paid back over a twenty-year period with electricity efficiency savings.

Despite these significant electricity savings, the cost of electricity continues to increase based on increased oil prices and energy cost adjustments by utility companies. While overall consumption is down 9%, electricity costs have exceeded appropriations by 7%.

The impact of this bill will eliminate incentives for agencies to invest in energy efficiency retrofitting measures like the HGIA GEM\$ Loan program.

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on House Bill (H.B.) No. 2498, H.D. 1.

H.B. No. 2498, H.D. 1, amends Section 36-41, HRS, to limit the amount of budget appropriations for energy efficiency and renewable energy system retrofitting to an amount that is deemed appropriate by the Legislature. Currently, Section 36-41 provides that the amount of budget appropriations for energy efficiency and renewable energy system retrofitting will not fall below the pre-retrofitting energy budget and will rise in proportion to any increase in the agency's overall budget for the duration of the performance contract or project payment term.

B&F notes that currently many State departments and agencies have energy saving company (ESCO) contracts totaling in the hundreds of millions of dollars. These ESCO contracts were put in place based on Section 36-41. The proposed revision could have an adverse impact on the viability of the existing ESCO contracts and would

discourage the use of ESCO contracts in the future to meet Hawai'i's energy self-sufficiency goals.

Ulupono is concerned that if budgets are lowered after energy efficiency (EE) projects are installed and the subsequent costs are lowered, the department or agency may have little incentive to pursue EE as they reap no financial benefit for their departments. That being said, consistent funding should be provided for future EE retrofitting projects through the State Legislature should this measure move forward.


