



HADA applauds City and County of Honolulu's Director of Information Technology, Mark Wong, and his IT staff for their herculean efforts to transition a decades-old DMV vehicle registration system into a state-of-the-art electronic, online registration system. Mark Wong, the City and County of Honolulu's Director of Information Technology, and his staff after a herculean lift, have nearly rewritten all the code for programs needed to launch the new online vehicle registration and title system. Neighbor island DMVs can also participate in the system. Mark, who has led a couple dozen briefings, and put in countless hours of programming, will make a presentation at the HADA convention on Maui on the soon-to-be-completed system.

HADA members believe HB2674 will help facilitate the transition to eReg and eTitling and request that the committee pass the bill on to its next committee for favorable consideration.

Aloha Chair Aquino and committee members. I am Gareth Sakakida Managing Director of the Hawaii Transportation Association (HTA) with over 400 members involved with the commercial ground transportation industry.

HTA supports this bill.

The ability to take advantage of technology is a great time saver, especially for entities with multiple vehicles to register.

For the commercial vehicle industry, there are documents that are connected to power units (but not to trailers) to prove payment of the federal heavy vehicle use tax. These clearance forms are easily scanned and can be sent in electronic format for motor vehicle registration.

Dear Chair Aquino, Vice Chair Hashimoto, and Members of the Committee,

Matson <u>strongly supports</u> HB2674, Relating to Motor Vehicle Registration. This measure requires that any authorization by a county director of finance for electronic motor vehicle registration shall apply to all motor vehicles.

Currently, only personal motor vehicles are able to submit electronically registration documents to the State and the respective county. Registration for all other types of motor vehicles requires submission of paper documents. The means of accepting electronic registration documents are already in place.

Matson requests an amendment on page 1, line 12 to allow the authorization to extend to intermodal equipment as well as all types of vehicles. Intermodal equipment means trailing equipment that is used in the intermodal transportation of containers over roadways, including trailers and shipping container chassis.

Allowing electronic registration for all types of motor vehicles, including shipping container chassis, would enable the State, counties, and companies like Matson to save time and cost.
