Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members <u>statewide</u>, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawaii Farm Bureau is in support of HB 860, which appropriates funds to the agribusiness development corporation to acquire the Kunia Dow DuPont Pioneer Land.

HFB believes that in order for agriculture to flourish in Hawaii and reach their full potential, land availability and long-term leases at affordable and predictable lease rental rates are critical. Dear Chair Yamane and members of your committee,

I regret not being able to attend due to a prior commitment, but I believe this is a very important proposal for the development of agricultural new farming opportunities.

The land referred to in this bill is prime agricultural land; it is close to the market; right off the freeway; has superior infrastructure in place (several large greenhouses), irrigation in place with conservation measures already installed. In addition it has office and laboratory facilities and agriculturally related structures. There will be no issues in deriving revenue from this ready to farm land.
