Chair McKelvey, Vice Chair Kitagawa and Members of the Committee. The Office of Aerospace Development (OAD) offers the following comments on HB 875, which creates a committee called the International Moon Base Alliance to provide recommendations and guidance for the development of a prototype moon base on the island of Hawaii and appropriates a sum to be expended by the OAD.

At present, the Office of Aerospace Development does not have the sufficient staff or resources to support another space committee. There is already within DBEDT, the Hawaii Aerospace Advisory Committee and the Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems Board, both of which may be able to provide the recommendations and guidance for the evolvable lunar architecture.

With limited resources, OAD has prioritized supporting growth of businesses that have potential to create the most jobs.

Aloha Representatives of the Hawaii State Legislature:

I am offering my strong support of House Bill 875: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE INTERNATIONAL MOON BASE ALLIANCE.

I have been working to create a world class space exploration industry in Hawaii for many years. Did you know that Hawaii is one of the best places on Earth to simulate the Moon's terrain? The oceanic crust-based lava rock found on the Big Island is almost identical in composition to the rock found on the Moon (and Mars).

Hawaii can be the world leader in the settlement of the Moon and the leader in space settlement in general. I am asking for:

- Land to build the International Lunar Research Park (ILRP). There are 1,000 acres of barren lava rock terrain on the Big Island that would be ideal for this project.
- Additional funding to extend my personally funded efforts.
- Support from YOU.

In the next decade, humankind will create a permanent self-sustaining settlement on the Moon, with or without us.

China has already declared that they will do this by themselves. The United States of America must stay competitive, as the other space-faring nations (Russia, Europe, Japan, Korea, India) will be close behind.

I have been speaking at industry-leading conferences around the world to share my vision: to build Moon Base prototypes (analogs) and a research campus on the Big Island of Hawaii via a global collaboration with space agencies (i.e., NASA, the European Space Agency, Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency), companies (i.e., SpaceX, Blue Origin) and universities (i.e., MIT, Arizona State University, Stanford).

Hawaii's unique terrain on the Big Island becomes an even more compelling reason to establish a first-of-its-kind research facility.

The Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems (PISCES) has been focused on bringing the space exploration business to Hawaii. As the Chairman of PISCES, I have been able to add my voice to the discussions along with our board members and staff. What has become abundantly clear is that in order to bring this trillion dollar industry to Hawaii, we need a magnet. The magnet is the development of the International Lunar Research Park (ILRP), with where we will develop the technologies necessary to create a permanent settlement on the moon through robotically building prototypes on the Big Island, leveraging In Situ Resource Utilization (ISRU).

We will follow strict research and development methodologies necessary for 100% reliability. These technologies include (but are not limited to) Robotics, Artificial Intelligence, Materials Science, 3D Printing, Human Factors, Underground Food Production, and Lunar Mining.

We plan to start with a NASA project codenamed "the NASA Lunar University" (NLU) which will be comprised of NASA and Hawaii subject matter experts. Ultimately, we would like to establish ongoing collaboratories between Silicon Valley based and Hawaii teams.

Hawaii's potential to be the leader in space exploration is tremendous. We need to invest in economic opportunities for our future generations beyond tourism, construction and the military, and I urge you to support this bill as an important step toward that goal.
