SUBJECT: EDN 600 and EDN 612 Supplemental Budget Briefing Testimony

Chair Dela Cruz and members of the Committee:

The State Public Charter School Commission ("Commission") appreciates this opportunity to submit this testimony on its proposed budget for the second year of the biennium for EDN 600 and EDN612. Section 1 of this testimony will focus on EDN 600- Charter Schools and Section 2 will cover EDN 612- Charter Schools Commission and Administration. As the sole authorizer of charter schools in the state, the Commission oversees the budgetary process, not only for itself (program ID- EDN 612), but also for all 37 operating public charter schools (program ID- EDN 600).

The State Public Charter School Commission appreciates the opportunity to discuss this year's budget and thanks the Chair and members of the Committee for your continuing support of Hawai`i's 37 public charter schools and approximately 12,100 students. The Commission remains prepared to work with the Legislature and other stakeholders to find additional innovative ways to improve learning options and opportunities for Hawai`i's students.

SECTION 1- EDN 600: CHARTER SCHOOLS

A. OVERVIEW

Mission Statement

Charter schools provide parents and students within the State of Hawaii an alternative to the traditional public school experience. Charter schools, while subject to the same State accountability requirements as all other public schools, serve as incubators of innovative approaches to educational, governance, financing, administration, curricula, technology, and teaching strategies.

Measures of Effectiveness

No measures have been formally adopted for this program however, all public charter schools operate on individualized charter contracts that establishes Academic, Organizational, and Financial Performance expectations, with the understanding that failure to meet those expectations and/or performance measures, may result in non-renewal of the charter contract and school closure.

This year, thirteen charter schools are subject to the Commission's renewal process and procedures. Charter schools that are renewed will receive five year contracts that may be subject to specific conditions and performance requirements. This renewal process will continue for the next two years for the remainder of the Commission's portfolio of charter schools.

Enrollment and Per-pupil Funding

37 public charter schools currently operate on the islands of Hawaii (number of schools on island- 14), Kauai (5), Maui (1), Molokai (1), and Oahu (16). DreamHouse Ewa Beach, the newest charter school, began operations in August 2019 with approximately 100 6th grade students.

Public charter school enrollment for the 2019-2020 fiscal year is **12,060 students**, which represents an increase of about 380 students from the 2018-2019 fiscal year, which equals about a three percent increase.

Public charter schools were allocated per-pupil funding of about \$96.2 million for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. This amount is determined by the operating appropriation to the Hawai'i Department of Education (DOE) and the schools' pro rata enrollment compared to the total public education enrollment. Following the October 15 enrollment count provided by the DOE, charter school enrollment was below projections, which resulted in a reduction in funding of approximately \$1.2 million. Following the 'true-up' of funding due to enrollment counts, the per-pupil amount for the current year is projected at \$7,873.

Federal Funds

For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, the Commission received and administered approximately **\$18 million**¹ in federal funds. Of the \$18 million, the Commission served as a pass-through for about \$15.6 million, or approximately 87 percent of the funds received, to public charter schools.

Public charter schools receive federal funding through the DOE for the major federal education programs such as Title I, Part A; Title II, Part A; Title III; and IDEA, Part B. Approximately \$11.5 million was distributed to public charter schools last fiscal year for the federal Title programs. Also, about \$627,300 for special education funding and US Department of Education-Department of Defense Impact Aid funds, in the amount of \$2.5 million, were distributed to the schools in fiscal year 2019.

C. SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET REQUESTS

Non-general Fund Requests

The proposed supplemental budget request does not include any requests for additional non-general funds for public charter schools.

General Fund Requests

Requests for additional general funds for the biennium have been proposed in the Supplemental Executive Budget for the following:

o Per-pupil adjustments

- Amount of funding requested: \$2,337,303 FY2020-2021
- Purpose of request: Statutory adjustment made to equalize per-pupil funding due to proposed increases to major DOE program IDs (EDN 100, EDN 200, EDN 300, and EDN 400).

Funding for teacher differential payments

- Amount of funding requested: \$1,448,250 for FY2019-2020; \$1,933,500 for FY2020-2021
- Purpose of request: Provide funding for the teacher differentials for hard-to-staff and Hawaiian immersion teachers as approved by the Board of Education.

SECTION 2- EDN 612: CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION AND ADMINISTRATION

A. OVERVIEW

Mission Statement

The statutory mission of the Commission is "to authorize high-quality public charter schools throughout the State." (HRS 302D-3(b)). The Commission's strategic vision for the chartering of these high-quality schools is that they provide excellent and diverse educational options for Hawai`i's families, prepare our students for future academic or career success, and contribute meaningfully to the continued improvement of Hawai`i's public education system as a whole.

Statement of Program Objectives

To authorize high-quality public charter schools throughout the State.

Measures of Effectiveness

The Commission has adopted and put into action its strategic plan, which includes an implementation plan that provides a timeline and deliverables which actualize the outcomes and goals that the strategic plan intends. The Commission continues to work collaborate with the Pacific Resources for Education and Learning² and the Building State Capacity and Productivity Center on School Turnaround (BCSP)³, a US-DOE funded program, on the implementation of the strategic plan.

Authorizer Duties and Responsibilities

Section 302D-3, HRS, establishes the Commission as an agency administratively attached to the Department of Education (DOE) that is empowered with statewide chartering jurisdiction and authority. As the charter school authorizer, the Commission:

- Serves as the point of contact between the DOE and public charter schools;
- 2. Ensures the compliance of public charter schools with all applicable state and federal laws;
- 3. Serves as the pass-through for the distribution of federal funds provided to the DOE and allocated to public charter schools; and
- 4. Serves as the pass-through for the distribution of per-pupil funding received from the State and allocated to public charter schools.

Federal Funds

For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, the Commission received and administered approximately **\$18 million** in federal funds. Of the \$18 million, the Commission expended about \$2.3 million, or approximately thirteen percent, of the funds received.

The Commission receives federal funding through the DOE for the major federal education programs such as Title I, Part A; Title II, Part A; Title III; and IDEA, Part B. These funds, specifically Title I funds, are used to provide direct support to schools identified for comprehensive support and improvement (CSI) and targeted support and achievement (TSI). This past fiscal year, the Commission initiated and administered programs intended to assist in academic growth and achievement, provide mentoring and coaching for charter school administrative leadership, and engage charter school governing boards in understanding its roles and responsibilities. The Commission also receives federal funding through the Preschool Development Grant for the administration of the program.

C. SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET REQUESTS

Non-general Fund Requests

The proposed supplemental budget request does not provide additional non-general funds to the Commission.

General Fund Requests

The proposed supplemental budget request does not provide additional general funds to the Commission.

The Commission did submit a request for **\$160,000** to provide funding for School Leads positions. School Leads, a section of the Commission that resulted from the strategic planning process and the new organizational structure, work directly with each charter school's governing board to guide schools to compliance with the Charter Contract as well as foster the innovations and high-quality charter practices of charter schools in the Commission's portfolio. This request was not approved for inclusion in the proposed executive supplemental budget.

Early Learning Program- Charter Schools

Though not associated with any budget requests for EDN 600 and EDN 612, the Commission appreciates the funding provided to public charter schools and the Commission for its Early Learning program through the Executive Office of Early Learning (EDN 700).

\$4 million of funding is provided for the charter school Early Learning program in both years of the current biennium. This funding allows early learning opportunities for about 260 students in seventeen pre-kindergarten classrooms in eleven charter schools; that results in about seventy-five percent of program-wide capacity. Five of these classrooms are Hawaiian immersion early learning programs.
