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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawai'i is requested to submit a report of its review to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2020, and a follow-up report on the implementation of any necessary changes identified in its review no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, President of the 11 University of Hawai'i System, Chair of the Board of Regents of 12 the University of Hawai'i, and Executive Director of the 13 University of Hawai'i Professional Assembly.



Board of Regents Policy 9.202: UH Manoa Faculty Classifications¹

The board faculty classification system includes seven general categories* for the University of Hawaii at Manoa with grades within each category.

- 1) <u>I Instruction</u> graduate teaching assistants, lecturers, instructors, assistant professors, associate professors, and professors
- 2) **<u>R Research</u>** junior researchers, assistant researchers, associate researchers, and researchers
- 3) <u>S Specialist</u> junior specialists, assistant specialists, associate specialists, and specialists; the S series is used for specialities not primarily involved with research. Excluded at West Oahu and Hilo. APT's created to replace non-instructional specialists
- 4) <u>M Medical</u> instructional positions in the clinical disciplines at the School of Medicine, and the Cancer Research Center
- 5) <u>**I Law**</u> instructional positions within JABSOM
- 6) <u>L Librarian</u> includes ranks II to V
- 7) <u>A Extension Agent</u> junior extension agents, assistant extension agents, associate extension agents, and county extension agents
- *NOTE: Comparable institutions have only 3 classifications:
 - 1. Full professor
 - 2. Assistant
 - 3. Associate

The faculty classification system includes three categories for the University of Hawaii at Hilo and the University of Hawaii, West Oahu, with grades within each category:

- 1) **Instruction** ('I' for all faculty), includes graduates teaching assistants, instructors, assistant professors, associate professors, and professors.
- 2) **Lecturers** include persons employed for short-term teaching assignments, usually on a part-time basis.
- 3) <u>Affiliate faculty</u> is a non-compensated appointment usually to professional personnel with a particular interest or capability which may contribute to the teaching or research program of the campus; except for occasional lectures or consulting with individual students, affiliate faculty do no teaching. Authority to appoint affiliate faculty is delegated to the president who shall promulgate policies and procedures relating to the selection and appointment of affiliate faculty.
