- 1 **EOA's Position:** The Executive Office on Aging (EOA), an attached agency to the Department
- 2 of Health supports the intent of SB1029 and offers comments on this measure.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: None
- 4 **Purpose and Justification:** This measure requires the Policy Advisory Board for Elder Affairs
- 5 (PABEA) to establish quorum requirement through its bylaws and post its bylaws on the
- 6 Executive Office on Aging's website. PABEA is established by statute in HRS 349-4 to advise
- 7 the director of EOA including but not limited to: 1) identification of issues and alternative
- 8 approaches to solutions; 2) development of position statements and papers; 3) advocacy and
- 9 legislative actions; and 4) program development and operations. PABEA meets on the first

- 1 Friday of the month and has provided EOA with feedback on our programs and been a strong
- 2 advocate for our kupuna. Last year, PABEA requested a statute amendment to change the
- 3 composition of the Board by: 1) decreasing the number of members; 2) specifying that ex-officio
- 4 member are nonvoting members, and 3) revising the list of agencies that provide representatives
- 5 to serve as ex-officio members. The Governor signed Act 134 into law on July 5, 2018.
- 6 However, even with decreasing the number of members that will constitute a quorum to conduct
- 7 its meetings, PABEA has a difficult time meeting the default quorum of fifty per cent of
- 8 members plus one.

- 9 **Recommendation**: EOA would like to suggest language that quorum be "a majority of the
- 10 currently serving members, but in no event fewer than eight, shall constitute quorum". This may
- 11 help the situation when PABEA has fewer than its maximum 21 members, and yet ensure that it
- never goes lower than its statutorily-mandated minimum number of members.
