Surfrider's Hawaii Chapters support this bill to night-time scuba fishing without a permit to support the health of our coral reefs, which are already in decline. These fish eat the algae on the reefs and help maintain a healthy ecosystem, but their populations have been greatly reduced due to illegal fishing. The flashlights disturb the fish, and the reefs are often damaged by their fins and equipment. Along with the ecological damage to our reefs and ecosystems, these collection practices will also hurt our economy if tourists see that our coral reefs are dying and there are no fish.
