Aloha Committee Chair, Co-Chair and Committee Members,

Although I support conducting inspections of HEMP crops, I cannot support this bill as it includes harsh penalties if a crop tests higher than 0.3% THC. Growers strive to keep the levels to allowable amounts but THC is the plant's natural sunscreen and so levels are the result of how much light the plant receives. Violations are likely accidental rather than intentional and should be treated as such, so revoking or suspending a grower's license is a harsh penalty.
