RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES

Senate Bill (S.B.) No. 1386: requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) to develop and achieve a State 2030 natural resources conservation goal action plan; allocates 1% of Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues to accomplish the action plan; and appropriates \$350,000 in general funds in FY 20 and FY 21 to develop the action plan.

The Department of Budget and Finance notes that S.B. No. 1386 only allocates the 1% of TAT revenues (about \$6.2 million per year) to achieve the plan. The measure does not specify which DLNR special fund is to receive the new allocation and no special fund appropriation is made to expend the proposed allocation.
