Bill No. and Title: Senate Bill No. 164, Relating to Unadjudicated Traffic Fines.

Purpose: Transfers certain fines and forfeitures collected for uncontested traffic infractions to the counties.

Judiciary's Position:

The Judiciary takes no position as to the merits of this bill, but wishes to comment on certain operational and technical aspects. The Judiciary respectfully recommends that reference to paying the "administrative costs of the traffic violations bureau" be removed, and, should this bill move forward, a specific amount to be transferred be established.

Determining the exact "administrative costs" incurred in operating the TVB in four different circuits would be extremely complex and the accounting to do this would be expensive and time consuming. With respect to staff salaries, it is easy to identify the amounts for positions that are identified as dedicated to TVB positions; however, many of the District Court personnel, court

administrators, and judges work in traffic violation activities but are not dedicated to those functions alone. With regard to support costs, they would include a large element of the Judiciary Information Management System (JIMS), the primary computer database for handling traffic offenses. In addition, there is the non-District Court "support staff" which plays an important role in TVB functions, such as JIMS staff, Information Technology and Communications Division staff, and fiscal officers. It should also be noted that the costs related to the printing of statewide traffic citations was \$175,005.48 in 2018.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony in support of SB 164, Relating to Unadjudicated Traffic Fines, which is included in the Hawai'i State Association of Counties (HSAC) Legislative Package. My testimony is submitted in my individual capacity as a Member of the Kaua'i County Council.

I support SB 164 to redirect unadjudicated traffic fines to the counties. Currently, I am researching methods by which the County can utilize these funds to potentially offer some type of assistance program that would be targeted towards those citizens struggling financially. This redirection of funds would very much lighten the load on the state court system. These would typically be people who fail to obtain a vehicle safety check, thus stimulating a poverty cycle that includes not being able to get registration, insurance, etc. These are often the people who have to attend multiple court hearings or meet community service requirements that can cause job loss and further the cycle of poverty. There are many ways this diversion could not only alleviate court time, but also many other layers of state costs.
