Title of Bill: SB 2325 RELATING TO SCHOOL BUSES.

Purpose of Bill: Requires all school bus contracts to require contractor's vehicles to be

propelled by electric power or a non-fossil fuel and to be equipped with

seat belt assemblies by January 1, 2030.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education supports the overall intent of SB 2325 as it includes initiatives supportive of State of Hawaii's energy goals and offers the following comments.

The Department has concerns about the cost to electrify the school buses. The current cost could be more than three times the price of standard diesel fuel school bus vehicles.

As with all technology, we expect the advancement of electric power technology to continue to make improvements in efficiencies and reduce the cost to operate and manufacture electric school buses. We also note that while electric vehicles are one option, hydrogen fuel cell technology is quickly developing into what could be another viable alternative to electric buses.

As for the safety equipment, three-point passenger safety restraints on school bus vehicles is quickly becoming a much more affordable option in the school bus manufacturing industry. Although it has not yet achieved standard equipment status, we are hopeful in its becoming a more commonplace safety feature in school bus design.

Furthermore, as these safety accessories become the norm for all buses, we expect the associated cost to be imbedded into the overall cost of the bus.

The Hawai'i State Department of Education is committed to delivering on our promises to students, providing an equitable, excellent, and innovative learning environment in every school to engage and elevate our communities.
